To date, it appears no action has been taken to address this interest seriously. Instead, former Title IX annual reports reflect a struggle to establish a girls' golf team for which responses on the interest survey have been marginal. By June 15, 2008, submit a detailed report to the KHSAA on the efforts that have been made in the past to address the interest in girls' soccer, and the results that have come from those efforts. Resubmit an amended Form T-60, Corrective Action Plan, which reflects the school's plan to address the interest in the 2008-2009 school year. Since the school has not met any of the standards for compliance with Title IX on any of the three tests, this action should have priority over other corrective actions.</p>





Soccer Interest at Rockcastle County High School

Spring 2007

1. Seeing the interests in soccer indicated by the KHSAA's Student Interest Surveys, Rockcastle County High School purchased two regulation soccer goals, as there were no soccer goals of regulation size located within the county.

Fall 2008

1. Due to the interest of soccer shown in the results of the KHSAA's Student Interest Survey, Rockcastle County High School asked the physical education teachers to develop teaching units for the game of soccer to be introduced to the students taking physical education at Rockcastle County High School during the 2007-2008 school year.

Without a lower level soccer program we hope to use the soccer units in physical education classes as a way to teach and build on the skills needed for our athletes to compete interscholastically.

Spring 2008

1. Due to the interest in the KHSAA's Student Interest Survey, the administration of Rockcastle County High School decided to begin to find the true interest of those seeking to add soccer as an interscholastic sport at RCHS, by advertising a meeting of those students at RCHS in grades 9, 10, and 11, and those students at Rockcastle County Middle School in eighth grade who were interested in an intramural soccer program that could begin as early as the Fall of 2008. Students who were interested met with Mr. Barry Noble, Athletic Director, and told of the plans of a possible implementation of an intramural soccer program for the fall of 2008. Two meetings took place (March 30, 2008 and April 8, 2008). Sixty-nine (69) total students met in the two meetings. Forty (40) females signed up due to their interest in a soccer intramural program, while twenty-nine (29) males signed up. These numbers were quite lower than the interest shown in the Student Interests surveys conducted during the winter. During the winter surveys, there were a total of 136 (85 females and 51 males) student-athletes that stated they wanted soccer as a sport at RCHS.
