X	Other Recommendation and Comments: According to calculations, information, and responses submitted, the school seems to be meeting the standard established in both Tests 1 and 3 for provision of athletic opportunities. The information on the most recent student athletic survey supports the responses on Test 3. In the area of benefits, athletic spending appears to be slightly <u>outside acceptable parameters</u> (i.e. \$370 per male athlete and \$269 per female athlete). This spending should be monitored during 2008-09 to insure that relative parity is established. The school's Corrective Action Plan seems to appropriately address the needs designated on the T-41 form.
