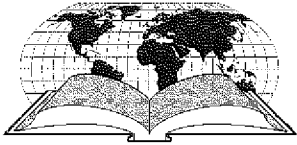

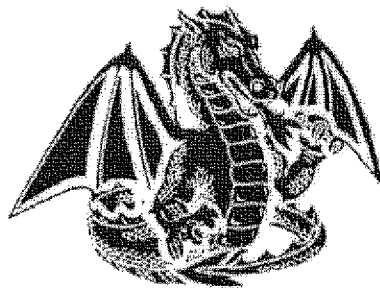

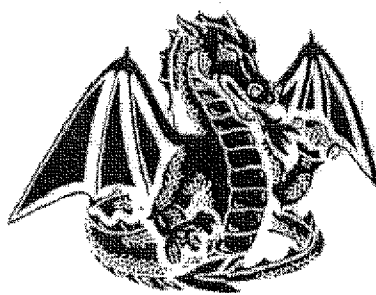

- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).

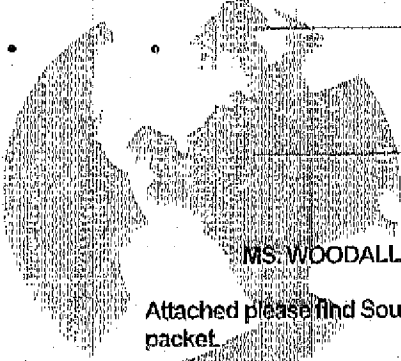
