### Follow-Up to 2006-2007 Action Plan

Re: Adding Girls' Lacrosse Date: September 15<sup>th</sup>, 2007

In an effort to add another girls' varsity sport, the Athletic Department attempted to follow-up and gauge participation interest in girls' lacrosse and the feasibility of adding it in the spring 2008 season. After conducting sign-ups at the school there were only seven (7) girls' who indicated a legitimate interest in girls' lacrosse. At least fifteen (15) would be required in order to field a complete team with an adequate amount of substitute players. Also, the remaining girls' who are interested cannot be accommodated by participating on the boys' lacrosse team. Based on correspondence received from US Lacrosse and the Kentucky Lacrosse Association, girls' are not permitted to participate on boys' lacrosse teams for the reason set forth in their three part position (see attached correspondence).

It is noteworthy that several girls did sign up for swimming/diving which the school does not currently offer, but is examining offering in order to achieve Title IX compliance. The Athletic Department will be looking into the feasibility of adding this as a club sport and then potentially upgrading it to a varsity sport the subsequent year if the interest remains. A coach or school sponsor will be sought, as well as a facility location and estimation of costs associated with introducing the sport. The feasibility study should be concluded by the end of the 2007 – 2008 school year, so it can be introduced as a club sport in the 2008 – 2009 school year barring any financial or participation issues.

Below is a three part position the US Lacrosse board of directors approved in January 2006...

### Position

The position of US Lacrosse with respect to gender classifications in lacrosse is as follows:

- A. Lacrosse as a sport encompasses two separate and distinct games, the women's game and the men's game.
- B. US Lacrosse respects and supports the integrity of both the women's game and the men's game and the fact that both tradition and the rules of play for the women's game are intended to limit participation in the women's game to females and tradition and the rules of play for the men's game are intended to limit participation in the men's game to males.
- C. It is the position of US Lacrosse that consistent with applicable laws, participation in the game of women's lacrosse should be limited to females and participation in the game of men's lacrosse should be limited to males. US Lacrosse therefore supports separate teams for males and females, and encourages and supports development of separate programs for both genders at youth, scholastic, non-scholastic, collegiate and post collegiate levels.

### **Explanation of Advantages**

### **Accommodation of Interests and Abilities**

Currently we have five boys' varsity sports and one junior varsity boys' sport, compared with only four girls' varsity sports. The girls were unable to obtain enough participants to field a junior varsity basketball team, and at one point almost did not have enough players to finish the remainder of their varsity season. We are still considering and trying to gain support for the addition of another girls' varsity sport. Based on the student surveys from this year, the best candidates are volleyball and swimming/diving. Volleyball poses a problem in that it is a fall sport and could perhaps affect participation with field hockey, our other girls' fall varsity sport which has seen a recent increase in competitiveness and participation. Thus, we will continue to examine the costs and feasibility of supporting girls' swimming/diving with the hopes adding it on a club basis for a year and then upgrading it to a varsity sport the following year assuming participation remains constant.

### **Equipment and Supplies**

Based on the 2006-2007 expenditures more money was spent on girls' programs than boys' in this fiscal period. The school purchased new home and away jerseys for the girls' basketball team resulting in a \$2,700 difference from the amount spent on the boys' team for equipment and supplies. Both girls' and boys' track teams received new uniforms as well (purchased by the booster club), but the girls' top was slightly more expensive than the boys' although the same number of uniforms were ordered for both teams.

### **Coaching Salaries**

Currently, we still have one additional boys' sport and have and a related coaching expense of \$6,800. Until a new varsity sport is added for girls', the apparent deficiency in salaries will exist. All coaching salaries are determined by qualifications, years of experience, and years coaching at the school. All returning coaches who have performed adequately receive a standard raise in their coaching stipend each year.

Jason Bell gave us an update of our corrective action plan for Title IX: First of all, SFHS was in compliance with the Title IX requirements 2006-2007

- 1) Booster Club created By-Laws which need approval for final passage, bylaws have been given to administration for editing/changes, final draft will be presented to both the Title IX committee and the Booster Club
- 2) Title IX By-Laws are in process; this year is not our turn for a visit from the Title IX powers that be, Title IX manual must be on file with Head of School, Athletic Director, and Title IX Coordinator
- 3) Feasibility of adding a girls' sport
- A) interest in lacrosse has dwindled to only 2 thus far; can girls play on the boys' team. Concern over safety, insurance issues, possibility of joining another girls' lacrosse team (possibly another independent school). Having the girls join a preexisting team at another school is our first choice. It makes sense for girls to play under the same rules that they would play in college. However, if this is not possible they will join the boys' team pending authorization from the govern bodies. Jason Bell will check with the KLA and US Lacrosse to see if it is allowable.
- B) swimming possible Will hold signups to gauge interest in swimming for girls as well as boys, possibly begin this year as a club if there is enough interest and move to full sport status in 2008-2009 if the interest level can be sustained. Possible beginning coaches include Angela Katz or unnamed parent who swam in college.

### Four main topics were discussed:

- Final Passage of Booster Club Bylaws
   -Copies are on file in Alexandra, Mark and Jason's offices. Jason's office is the most convenient for viewing if need be.
- Status of Girls' Lacrosse
  - -Jason spoke with a representative of the KLA (Kentucky Lacrosse Association) on the issue. They suggested that we follow the policy of the National Team, which is having our girls join another girls lacrosse program.
  - -Jason will make calls to outside schools to arrange for either a spot on their team or a tryout.
- Status of Swimming
  - -Currently, we have 20 students signed up to participate for swimming.
