Е	X	Other Recommendation and Comments: According to the information on the T-3 form, the school appears to be meeting the standard established in Test 3 for provision of athletic opportunities. The fact that a swimming pool is not available and there are too few schools in the area offering archery make both these sports not feasible at this time. In the area of benefits, total athletic spending is barely within acceptable parameters (i.e. \$597 per male compared to \$499 per female athlete). School officials should continue to monitor this spending for parity as is indicated on the Corrective Action Plan which does seem to address the areas of need designated on the T-41 form.
