#### Plans to Address Interest:

Number of students interested in the sports that we don't offer: Boys Soccer (34), Girls Soccer (73), Boys Swimming & Diving (41), Girls Swimming & Diving (96), Boys Indoor Track (40), Girls Indoor Track (46), Boys Track (33), Girls Track (46).

These numbers are so misleading. 132 students checked they wanted to play football yet only 38 students participate on the football team and no one was cut from the team. 80 girls checked they wanted to play volleyball yet we had to go down to the 6<sup>th</sup> grade to find enough girls to fill the freshman team.

We have no plans in the next two to three years to add any new teams other than to try to revive our girls' golf program and this is the first year we haven't had a girls freshman basketball team over the past 22 years. Our girls JV basketball team was 90% middle school players. We feel sure our girls' freshman basketball team will compete next year.

The principal and athletic director will work to see if there is a viable interest in the possibility of starting a girls' soccer team. This process will be a year long process beginning with the 2008-2009 school year. We will conduct meetings with students interested, study costs and present to the Superintendent in the spring of 2009. (Superintendent has stated there will be no sports added in 2008-2009.) If anything, we may lose a program (boys). We have a serious financial crisis. All sports teams' budgets have been reduced by 60% for 2008-2009. This is the first year our numbers (boys/girls) have favored the boys' side. We did not have a girls' freshmen basketball team this year for the first time in my 22 years. We certainly will have one next season. The reason was the same 14 girls played an entire middle school season and a junior varsity season, so they would have been playing four nights a week.
