The school's awards policy should be revised or rewritten to insure equity in awards received by athletes. All coaches should be notified of this policy. T-35 and T-36 forms for next year should reflect changes in this policy. Any differences in benefits, such as travel, should be explained on an appendix or possibly on T-60. Spending for male athletes far exceeds normal perimeters. The difference in spending per male versus female athlete should not be more than \$100. This year the difference was \$650 more per male. Before any new facility or facility improvement for males, the new locker room for females should be completed. Possibly some work on the outfield fence for softball could be done. The Gende

Equity Committee must monitor all spending for all sports. The Administration must keep equity a priority when approving spending.
