Ë.	X	Other Recommendation and Comments: All calculations appear to be correct. According to data and responses submitted by the school, it is meeting the standard established in Test 3 for the provision of athletic opportunities. The school addressed the indicated interest in girls soccer for validity in 2008. The 2010 survey still shows some interest(33). The interest should continue to be monitored in order to maintain the standard established in Test 3. In the area of benefits, total athletic spending seems to be outside of acceptable parameters for the provision of parity on both a percentage and per athlete basis. This is the second consecutive year that this disparity has existed. (Refer to T-65 form, 2008-09 Annual Report.) THIS SITUATION IS MENTIONED ON THE CURRENT CORRECTIVE ACTION PLAN. NO SPECIFIC STEPS FOR MONITORING SPENDING ARE DOCUMENTED. It seems there is much work to be done in both the areas of opportunities and benefits in relation to the provision of parity.

- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male.
