Dan,

I had 63 girls and 94 boys that participated in this years SMB program. That translated into 21 teams. The success of this year's program was simply the number of kids who signed up to play being that it was a totally new program. Janet and I sat down after a few weeks after it was completed and she is anticipating over 200 kids or more for next year after having talked to parents who hadn't signed up their kids this year but said they would definitely sign them up next year after hearing about how well it went. She is anticipating having to use the middle school gym as well next year in order to accommodate the number of kids and the number of games that we will have to schedule.

My goal is to acquire two more portable goals so that I can play more of the younger kids at the same time on those goals and then move them and finish playing the older kids on the regular goals.

I also used high school basketball players to help coach this year and they did a wonderful job. Not only did they do a good job of coaching the younger kids but they also gave the younger kids someone to look up to and try to emulate. This years bunch of high school kids were a really good kids so they worked out well as the role models I wanted them to be. No matter how many kids we have, I would still like to somehow incorporate some skill work into the program. I'll have to get more help to do that but that is still my goal in the future.

Overall, it was a big success and I think that I had it organized well enough that everything ran the way it should and the parents seem to appreciate the fact that the games started and ended at the time they were scheduled to every Saturday. I got great help from the coaches of both the middle and high schools and I had a really good group of volunteers who help me keep the clocks and books and officiated when needed so it was a pretty good community wide activity. Hopefully, we can improve on it even more next year and the years to come and make it a much anticipated activity for the kids as well and then maybe it will pay big benefits to our basketball programs down the line.
