a one year period, but there is no explanation for the past three years vast
difference in spending for Baseball and Softball. The Gender Equity Committee
needs to look at this and give a report back to the KHSAA on how this potential
red flag issues can be eliminated. This report needs to be in by September 1,
2010.
 The T-35 and T-36 report indicate that no school money was spent for travel for

Cross Country, Golf, Swimming, Baseball, Softball or Tennis. In comparing the past three years a big difference appears in Travel Spending. No one travels for free in today's world and the correct figures are not being reflected in this report. The Gender Equity Committee needs to take a look at the T-35 and T-36 report and re-submit it to the KHSAA by September 1, 2010.

- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
