11 Status 2009-2010 Forms are satisfactory and no further information or action is necessary at Α. this time. Errors have been noted with respect to the following forms: Β. The following forms were omitted and must be submitted by school representatives: X C. Form T-63 was not a part of the school's report, therefore, T-3 could not be verified. (See recommendations and comments below.) According to the 2009-2010 data, the school appears to be meeting the standards X D. established in: ⊠Test 1 (Athletic participation is proportionate to enrollment) □ Test 2 (History and continuing practice of program expansion) □ Test 3 (Full and effective accommodation of interests and abilities). Other Recommendation and Comments: According to data, calculations, and responses X E submitted, the school is meeting the standard established in Test 1 for provision of athletic opportunities. It could not be verified if the school is meeting the standard established in Test 3 since the school did not administer the student athletic interest survey as required during the 2009-10 school year. When KHSAA representatives contacted the school's athletic director concerning this omission, school had been dismissed for summer break. This document serves as notification to school officials that the student athletic interest survey is to be administered during the next two consecutive school years (2010-11 and 2011-12), and used as a basis for evaluating compliance with Test 3 for the provision of athletic opportunities. In the area of benefits, total athletic spending appears to be within acceptable parameters both on a percentage and perathlete basis.
