Other Recommendation and Comments: At the present time it appears that Edmonson County High School is passing Test 3, however with what appears to be continued student interest in Soccer and Tennis this could well be potential for a Red Flag situation. Continue to monitor this situation and document in committee minutes every step you take to see if this student interest in Soccer and Tennis is genuine.
		In your Corrective Action Plan you did a good job of explaining why there was such a big difference in boys and girls expenditures this year. As you stated the Gender Equity Committee will continue to monitor this situation as the figures given in this report Indicate that the school is spending \$807.52 per male athlete compared to \$580.67 per female athlete. This is a difference of \$226.85. When you are a football playing school these figures will never be equal but when the difference is more than \$100.00 per athlete a potential red flag goes up. Hopefully the Gender Equity Committee has a plan in place that will eliminate this potential RED FLAG situation.

Plans to Address Interest:

On the current student suvery, when students were asked if the School District offers the sport(s) they want to play, a total of 13 students indicated No - they wanted to play soccer and a total of 5 students indicated No - they wanted to play tennis.

Students were later asked what sports they would like to play in the Fall. 54 students indicated soccer. When asked in the Spring, 53 indicated tennis.

These separate findings from this year's survey contradict each other.

At this time, the district has no plans to add any athletic teams to the current list of offerings. We will continue to monitor interest by students.


