Plans to Address Interest: Student Interest Survey indicates that there is an interest in football for boys. With no football facility and/or equipment I will approach the superintendent and board of education about this interest. I will propose to the board that we have a meeting with boys who will be in 9-12 for the 2010-2011 school year to see how many are truly interested in committing their time. If interest is truly there we will attempt to do a 7-man flag football intramural in the fall of 2010. Survey also indicates interest in volleyball; however, we have already purchased the volleyball system and have implemented intramural volleyball in March 2010 with approximately 20 girls in grades 6-12 participating. Our hope is to begin a jv season in the fall of 2011.

The Cloverport Board of Education met in special called session on December 21, 2009 at 4:00 p.m. in the Central Office with the following members present: (1) Lisa Hawley (2) Donna Hank (3) Susan Hendricks

Dr. John Millay, Superintendent, read the "Board Mission Statement" and "Goals/Expectations.

Donna Hanks, Vice Chairman, called the meeting to order at 4:00 p.m.

Order #5821 - Excuse Board Member

Upon the recommendation by Dr. Millay, a motion was made by Susan Hendricks and seconded by Donna Hanks to excuse the absence of Board Member Kenneth Finley. The motion passed unanimously.

Dr. Millay recommended that the Agenda be approved as presented. A motion was made by Donna Hanks and seconded by Susan Hendricks to approve the agenda as amended. The motion passed unanimously.

REPORTS:

- Lisa Hawley reported on her attendance at the recent KSBA regional meeting.
- Dr. Millay presented written copies of the FRYSC and Community Education activities for the month.
- Richard Blake presented written copies of the Head Start Program Information report and Financial Report. These were discussed in detail.
