E.	X	Other Recommendation and Comments: According to data and responses submitted, the school is meeting the standard established in Tests 1 and 3 for the provision of athletic opportunities. In order to continue to meet the standard established in Test 3, the school should address the marginal interest indicated in such sports as girl's soccer, girls tennis, and girls golf and determine the validity of expressed interest. In the area of benefits, total athletic spending is slightly outside of acceptable parameters on both a percentage and per athlete basis. The addendum attached to the report seems to provide a reasonable explanation for the short term disparity. Athletic spending should be monitored in the future for equitable provision of benefits.

- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of regular season competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event.
