cont'd	 The information given with this report indicates that a male student athlete is not represented on the Gender Equity Committee. It is highly recommended that both a male and female student athlete be represented on the Gender Equity Committee.
	 Although the over all expenditures per male and per female athletes appear to be in line the Gender Equity Committee needs to continue to look at the differences in coaches salaries and to have the minutes of the committee reflect the discussions concerning these potential red flag situations. The facts and figures in this report indicate the Gender Equity Committee look at a potential red flag situation in the expenditures in Equipment and Supplies and the major differences in Boys and Girls Basketball and in Baseball and Softball. The Gender Equity Committee needs to address the issues of Zero expenditures for travel in Boys/Girls Tennis. In today's world no one travels free. The Gender Equity Committee needs to look at the Awards Expenditures to determine if the cost of banquets and other end of the year activities are included. The Gender Equity Committee needs to send to the KHSAA by October 1, 2010 a copy of the Iroquois High School Athletic Awards Policy.

- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of regular season competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event. - 1) For Column 1, list the number of interscholastic teams offered for girls and boys at each competitive level (varsity, junior varsity, and freshman). For girls, total each of the entries in Rows 1, 2, and 3 into Row 4. For boys, total Rows 5, 6, and 7 into Row 8.
