- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1).

  Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first **date of regular season competition**, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event. Determine the total number of interscholastic athletics participants that are girls, (and place in Row 1, Column 3). In order to determine the total number of athletics participants, an individual should be counted each time he or she participates on a team. Calculate the percentage of female participation. (Row 1, Column 3 divided by Row 3, Column 3 and place in Row 1, Column 4.)
Calculate the percentage of male participation. (Row 2, Column 3 divided by Row 3, Column 3 and place in Row 2, Column 4.) Note: Row 1, Column 4 plus Row 2, Column 4 should total 100%.

Note: While being within three percent is <u>not</u> a formal compliance standard, if the percent listed in Row 1, Column 4 is within 3% of Row 1, Column 2, then it provides a good target within which compliance is likely.

Mr. Crisp, thank you for the resubmissions. This response is a well-meaning attempt to assist in the fine-tuning of the policies submitted to better assure lack of gender bias in the school's athletics program.

- 1. Regarding the differences in recording expenditures for cross country and track, the explanation given is satisfactory. I am assuming the travel expenditures for cross country should have been split between boys and girls as well. If not, please advise why girls' cross country had no travel expenses.
- 2. The policy on awards should begin with statements about the school's philosophy regarding awards, that all participants are eligible to earn awards, and that awards will be presented at a school function that is approved by school administration. It is a good idea. too, to provide a statement as to which entity pays for the awards and for the school event where they are presented, if a meal is involved; for example, athletics department, school district, booster club, civic club, etc.
- a. In order to be fair, clarification is needed regarding whether or not the maximum number of awards allowed refers to POSITION size or SQUAD size. For example, it is assumed the POSITION size for a football team (offense and defense) would be greater in number than that of the boys! or girls' cross country teams.
- b. The cost of awards depends on the number of awards. Perhaps it would be better to place a maximum price that can be paid for each award as well as the maximum number that can be awarded.
- c.It is suggested that the type of meal associated with the awards presentations be approved by athletics or school administration in order to balance out the type of "banquet" given for girls and boys over a two or three- year period.
- d. The policy should allow for special events, too, such as for teams that win district, regional, or state honors, as examples. e Make sure the policy covers institutional control over the CATEGORIES of awards that may be given, i.e.MVP, but not Worst Player of the Year!
- f. The awards benefit includes the placement of trophies, banners, team photographs, Halls of Fame, jersey retirements, etc, as well. Statements regarding those elements of the awards benefit should be addressed as well.
- 3. As concerns the generation of travel, place that item on Form T-60, Corrective Action Plan, and report progress made on the 2010-2011 annual Title IX report. The policies should cover transportation mode for practice and competition, special trips, per diem, on-campus meal service, and approval processes.

Please advise if I can be of further assistance.
