- Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. ### NOTES:

- 1. Archery Team: The school formed an Archery Team during the 2007-2008 school year. During the 2009-2010 school year the program had 54 participants. 36 males and 18 females. These students participated in archery from the first of November through the middle of March. Over 90% of these participants do not participate in any other athletic program.
- 2. SOCCER: Following previous surveys and follow-up meetings, the school system has begun a there/ four year phase in of a soccer program. With limited soccer developmental programs in the area, the decision was made to gradually implement this program. The 2009-10 school year had us playing both middle school boys and girls soccer; each involved approximately 22 students. This program will continue on with a JV soccer team being added for the 2010-11 school year. Depending on numbers, a varsity soccer team will be added for the 2011-12 or the 2012-13 school year. This plan has been approved by the Board of Education.
- 3. **WRESTLING**: While significant numbers indicated an interest in wrestling. Follow-up meetings had limited results. The school looked into possibly forming a club/intramural team for students; however, funding, limited number of people with sufficient knowledge, and liability issues have force this issue to be delayed/postponed.
- 4. BASEBALL & SOFTBALL: In an effort to meet interest and to provide an opportunity to increase participation numbers at the high school, the school system is in the process of phasing in Middle School Softball and Baseball. MS Baseball started Spring 2010 while MS softball will begin Fall 2010.
- 5. MIDDLE SCHOOL SPORTS: In an effort to increase participation numbers in various sports, the high school is gradually taking over management of several middle school sports programs. It is hoped that this effort will improve publicity of available sports offerings at the high school level. Increase participant levels at the middle school level and thus increase them at the high school level, especially for girls.
