In order to meet the standard for Test 3, this must be addressed. This should be reviewed by the Gender Equity Committee and future Corrective Action Plans should include how the school is addressing these interests and their viability. In the area of benefits, total athletic spending appears to be within the parameters for percentage and per athlete spending. Thank you.

- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male.
