Amy Thompson began the meeting by giving the committee members a brief description of the purpose of the Title IX committee which is to ensure that equality occurs for girl's athletic program in comparison with the boy's athletic program at Monroe County High School in respect to program offerings, facilities and funding.

The following was discussed:

The softball field has been repaired to correct the problem of the field not draining water properly. Several drains have been placed on the field and currently the Monroe County Middle School softball team is using the field. The drains have helped correct the problem.

Both girls and boys soccer season is underway. Numbers on both teams are low. Each team has just enough to field a team. The committee felt the reason for the low numbers is due to student interest in the sport.

The girl's volleyball team is having a successful season. They have won all four matches they have participated in and will be playing in the Class "A" Regional tournament this weekend in Clinton County.

Our cross-country team has had one meet. We have four girls and one boy on the team. We had two girls to place in the top nine finishers at the first meet.

Current fall sports are golf, soccer, cross-country, volleyball and football.

The girl's locker room will be receiving new lockers this fall. The old metal lockers will be replaced with wooden lockers.

The Title IX report for the 2008-2009 school year has been received and is acceptable. We were not chosen for an audit for the 2009-2010 school year.

The Title IX committee with meet again during the winter sports season as well as during the spring sports season. Dates will be set at a later date.

Title IX Winter Meeting December 14, 2009 Minutes

The August minutes were approved with a motion by Dwayne Murray and a second by John Petett. The December agenda was approved with a motion by Jeff Rippy and a second by Julie Nuckols.

Issues discussed:

- Softball field has been seeded and needs to be rolled before the season begins.
- Girls' volleyball had a very successful season. Jessa Curtis, student athlete, added that the girls had a 25-5 record for the 2009 season. They were the semi-finalist in the Logan Co. tournament, district champs for the 7th year in a row, won the All "A" 4th region tourney and finished 2nd in the bronze division in Class "A" State.
- There is a proposed realignment for the girls/boys soccer district. The athletic directors at MCHS declined the proposal due to the distance our student athletes would have to travel for district play. The athletic directors at MCHS are looking at other options which include moving to the 3 "A" division or playing an independent schedule.
- The soccer field needs six new light poles. The cost of each light pole is approximately \$1500. The existing poles are old and too tall for the electric company to reach the bulbs.
- Cassady Carter finished fourth in the region in cross-country and also qualified
 and competed in the state competition. Devon Gearlds received 16th in the region
 and also qualified for the state competition. Hopes are that there will be a full
 girls and boys' team for the 2010 season. A full team consists of five girls and
 five boys. Julie Nuckles, head coach, also stated that we are currently working on
 getting a track prepared for the 2010 season so we may host cross-country meets.
- The girls' golf team competed this year. All members of the girls' golf team are currently middle school students.
- New lockers should be installed in the girls' basketball dressing room by January 2010. There will be 22 new lockers which have been designed and built by local Area Technology Center students and instructors. This helps meet the financial requirements in Title IX.

• The spring meeting will occur in January 2010.

- Attendees expressed the need for an outdoor practice facility. The facility would provide girls' softball a dressing room during softball season and the football team an indoor practice area as well as storage.
- Currently, the track is in need of various repairs in order for MCHS to host a track meet.

- The soccer field has been seeded and follow-up will continue for lighting on the field.
- There will be a sandpit ready for the track team for the 2010 season.
- Work continues on the cross country track and there are hopes of hosting meets in fall 2010.
- New lockers are now being installed for the girls' basketball team.
- Tennis has a 15 match season schedule for 2010. There are nine girls and seven boys on the team. Ricky Miller is the new girls coach. All matches will be played away. Two courts are being built at the Monroe County Wellness Center and we hope to be able to use these facilities for our tennis team when they are complete.
- Track Thirty-three girls have come out for girls track for the 2010 season. These are a combination of middle and high school students. There eleven boys on the boys track team. There will be six meets for the 2010 season all being away and the meets will begin after spring break.
- Softball there are twelve high school girls and six middle school girls making up the varsity 2010 softball team. They have a thirty-six game regular season and tournament schedule. There are seventeen baseball players.
