**Review of Re-Visit Audit Report:** the committee was given a copy of the audit report from December; committee members were concerned about some of the suggested deficiencies in the report. Girls basketball team has to walk across gym to use restroom from their locker room is deficiency? Fayette County has policies about booster club agreements – deficiency?

**Proposal:** Mr. Orr proposed that male/female sport teams to more double headers. Possible double-headers could be done in boys/girls soccer, boys/girls basketball and baseball/ softball. Committee will continue to discuss topic to try form policy to implement 2010, some teams have already established their 2009 schedules and contracts.

**Awards & Travel per Diem allowance:** Committee revised the award for athletic teams to implement within their programs. Award policy divided into two categories: general awards from outside organizations and team awards. These categories were made more general/ specific for coaches to follow. See attached policy.

The travel per diem allowance was updated. This policy allows teams to spend a per diem per athlete. See attached policy.

**Team approvals/Travel/Purchases:** Committee reviewed teams proposed travel for next fall: volleyball traveling – Florida Disney tournament/4 nights \$15,000, Indiana Camp/3 nights \$5000, Greenwood Tournament/1 night \$600. Girls soccer – Nashville tournament/ 1 night \$4000, equipment bags \$2000, new white uniform \$3500. Boys soccer – Illinois tournament/ 1 night \$2600. Cross Country – boys/girls team North Carolina tournament 2 nights \$6200. Wrestling – purchasing of singlets \$2300. Football – replacement of white pants \$7600

All travel and purchases were approved.

**Meeting called to order:** Mr. Blackman called the meeting to order with giving background to Title IX and the responsibility of the committee. The committee would meet regularly to oversee purchasing and expenses made from all athletic programs at PLD.

**Review of Minutes:** Ms. Coleman reviewed minutes from meeting on March 24<sup>th</sup>, 2009 with committee. Ms. Coleman also explained the 3-prong test (opportunity, continuing practice of, full & effectively accommodating) on the Title IX report.

**Review Proposals:** Baseball proposed to go to Florida to participate in tournament. Average cost would be \$170 per player (budget \$8,000). Committee wanted to revisit Florida trip at next meeting and review expenses of trip. Baseball proposed trip to Bowling Green, average cost would be \$25 per player (budget \$600). *Bowling Green trip was approved.*

Softball proposed trip to Florida to participate in tournament. Average cost would be \$390 per player (budget \$8,600). Committee wanted to revisit Florida trip at next meeting and review expenses of trip. Softball proposed trip to Ashland, average cost would be \$22 per player. *Ashland trip was approved.*

**Review Expenditures of each Sport:** Committee review all expenditures of all teams from school account and booster accounts. Committee was concerned with boys golf expenses of \$3500 and girls golf of \$860.

**Uniform Policy Reviewed:** Wrestling was given opportunity to purchase uniforms early, however, should they be given opportunity to purchase again next year (2010-2011 school year)? Committee agreed to push wrestling up on the uniform rotation.

Ms. Coleman asked are warm-ups considered part of uniform policy? Committee agreed warm-ups were not considered part of the uniform policy, these items are not displayed on the field/court by the athlete
