- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- 4) Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of regular season competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event. Eligibility

After a student has applied for admission, successfully passed the enrollment test, and submitted the appropriate documentation to the Admissions Director, (English and math references, copies of report cards, and discipline report from the previous school), the family is sent a letter of acceptance. At that time, tuition and fees are discussed and an application for tuition assistance is given. If the family plans to apply for tuition assistance through School and Student Service, they are encouraged to apply on line for a faster return of information. A hard copy of the SSS application along with the UHA Tuition Assistance Request Form, tax schedules, 1040 tax statement, and W-2 forms the Tuition Assistance Request Form, W2, and income tax return must be submitted to the school before final consideration. After the Business Manager has been notified that the SSS application has been processed, the Enrollment Committee comprised of the Head of School, Business Manager, Admissions Director, Division Head, and two Trustees review the SSS recommendation. At that time tuition is set and an enrollment contract is issued.

D-1-2 Financial Aid Sources

Tuition paid by families receiving tuition assistance is added to the general fund. The reduction is absorbed by the school. Limited funds are available through individual donations to the school's Enrollment Fund. Donors do not have any input as to specific recipients. No funds generated by Booster Club activities or Booster Club donations are used for tuition assistance.

D-3 All families applying for tuition assistance in grades 1-12 regardless of athletic interest are required to provide copies of the School and Student Services for Financial Aid application, tax schedules, 1040 tax statement, and W-2 forms to UHA before the student can be considered for Financial Aid. The enrollment committee sets tuition based on the SSS recommendation and individual requirements per grade level.

University Heights Academy Admissions Policy

Students who seek admission to U.H.A. must provide copies of their most recent report card and discipline record from their current school. They will then be given an achievement test and/or I.Q. test. Students must perform in the average to above average intelligence range. Students entering KG-5th grade are tested by the classroom teachers or Admissions Director. The Admissions Director administers tests to students entering grades 6-12. Previous school performance will be considered. If additional information about a student is needed, parents and previous teachers or school administrators are consulted. All decisions regarding student admissions are subject to the Enrollment Committee's approval.

Procedures

- 1. All names of prospective students shall be given to the Admissions Director.
- 2. An Application for Admission should be completed and returned to the school along with a copy of the student's most recent report card, discipline report from the prior school, attendance record, achievement test scores, and the appropriate application and testing fee.
- 3. A testing appointment and school tour is scheduled with the Admissions Director. The student will complete the testing process including a writing assignment.
- 4. Upon successful completion of the admissions test, math and English teacher references should be delivered to the prior school's appropriate teachers and returned to University Heights Academy.
- 5. An acceptance letter is mailed to the family along with an enrollment contract.

Procedure For Requesting Financial Assistance

- 1. After all enrollment documents are submitted, the family may request consideration for tuition assistance using School and Student Service for Financial Aid. They are given an application packet and encouraged to apply on line for a faster return of information
- 2. The UHA Tuition Assistance Request Form, a copy of the SSS application, tax schedules, 1040 tax statement, and W-2 forms must be submitted to UHA before consideration.
- 3. After the Business Manager has been notified that the SSS application has been processed, the Admission Committee meets to review the recommendation. The Committee consists of the Head of School, Business Manager, Admissions Director, Division Head, Testing Teacher, and two Trustees. At that time tuition is set and an enrollment contract is issued.

First year students will be admitted for a probationary period. Their progress will be monitored at the mid grading period, end of the nine weeks, and end of the first semester. If a student has not met the standards of the Academy, dismissal may be considered.

If the student is a prospective athlete, the coaching staff shall have no contact with the student, but shall refer the student to the head of school.

No student will be denied admission on the basis of race, religion, color, sex, national or ethnic origin.

TUITION REFUND PLAN

Dewar's Tuition Refund Insurance protects the parent or guardian against loss of unearned tuition in case the student is unable to, or does not, complete the school year.
