There is a cheer clinic several days prior to tryouts. The cheers, dance, and/or jumps that will be required for tryouts are taught at the clinic, which is usually a floor cheer and a sideline or part of a dance routine.

The day of tryouts students draw numbers to determine which group they will be in. Depending on the number of students trying out, we have groups of 3 or 4. Each group is called in by number and performs either a floor cheer or sideline/dance routine. They do it at least two times or more if judges require it. After each group has performed the first required piece, the process is repeated for the second piece.

Before tryouts, the coach determines a total scored that is required for students to make the squad. For example, if the total points possible was 60, students had to score 40 or above.
