The KHSAA is in receipt of your Title IX Annual Report for the 2010-2011 academic year. We appreciate the initiative you have taken to explain the inequities in expenditures in relation to your football program on form T-35 and the corrective action plan that you have included in this report to resolve this issue in the future.

During our recent phone conversation, you stated that the reporting of expenditures on form T-35 for your football program may have been inaccurate in the past and that a significant amount of money that had been spent on equipment and supplies had not been reported for several years.

- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of regular season competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event. Determine the total number of interscholastic athletics participants that are girls, (and place in Row 1, Column 3). In order to determine the total number of athletics participants, an individual should be counted each time he or she participates on a team. Note: While being within three percent is <u>not</u> a formal compliance standard, if the percent listed in Row 1, Column 4 is within 3% of Row 1, Column 2, ther pt provides a good target within which compliance is likely.

- I. All Booster Club financial activities will move from their own outside banking institutions to the school financial office. There has been limited accountability in the past concerning the fundraising and spending activities of specific booster clubs (particularly football). By moving the accounts to the school office, head coaches and administrators will be able to monitor the various transactions.
- II. There will be limits placed on booster club fundraising activities, so spending inequities do not occur, as they have in the past.
- III. All sports (coaches) will be required to submit detailed budgets which should also help control spending inequities.
- IV. Guidelines will be set on the amount of funds which can spent on year-end awards and activities in each sport so that expenditures per student are more equitable throughout the school's sport programs. (Noted on form T-60 as well.)
- V. Schedule for uniform replacement has been put in place to insure proper equalities within all sports. This will also ensure that there will not be a spike in expenditures during any one year due to multiple teams buying new uniforms.
- VI. As indicated on form T-60, failure to renew the sports facilities plan has caused inequities in spending as well. With no plan in place, money is spent to repair facilities on an as needed basis which in turn causes inequities to occur during certain years.
- Last spring Bell County High School did initiate a girl's soccer program. The board of education spent @ \$25,000 for coaches, uniforms, equipment, and other expenses. Due to budgetary issues, all or most of these purchases orders were held until after June 30th, 2010. If these expenditures could have been reported, the inequity would not have been as bad as the report indicates.

 Hopefully, the changes listed above along with a new athletic administrator recently hired by the district will help address some of the issues we have experienced in the past.
