Our School district is on a staggered start system (High Schools & Middle Schools start at 7:40 and end at 2:25. Elementary Schools start at 8:30 and end at 3:30). This means we can't get a bus for athletic contests until 4:15 at the earliest. The second factor is our geographical location places us very close (within 10 miles) of 26 Northern Kentucky High Schools. Therefore most of our teams use parent transportation to and from sporting events. We use buses for all Football travel (dirty uniforms & equipment & large number of participants and for other sports when we go long distances out of town or staying for an extended period of time. Whoever uses school transportation has to pay for this transportation out of their individual accounts. We receive no assistance with this.

Boone County High School shows no financial assistance from Boosters. We do not have athletic Boosters here at BCHS. Each sport is responsible for fundraising the necessary dollar amount for their season and everyday expenses.
