The Gender Equity Committee needs to keep a close eye on the next Student Interest Survey (2011-2012) previous surveys indicate an interest in girls tennis, swimming and soccer and the school has indicated an intent to begin bowling. In order to continue to meet the requirements for Test 3 these interests should be addressed and checked for validity. This should be reviewed by the Gender Equity Committee and the step by step plans should be part of the Corrective Action Plan. - 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of regular season competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event. Determine the total number of interscholastic athletics participants that are girls, (and place in Row 1, Column 3).
