E.	Х	Other Recommendation and Comments:  The amount of money spent per athlete was skewed toward male participants by \$246.00. The KHSAA guideline for schools with football is to allow a \$100.00 difference per athlete between males and females. It would appear that the cause was the cost of facility maintenance or improvement for the football program. It is assumed the ratio of

expenditures between genders will be altered within the next year or two. It is strongly suggested that the Gender Equity Review Committee and school personnel monitor this imbalance continuously.

School personnel will provide a justification for no expenditures having been recorded for AWARDS in Softball, Cross-Country, Golf, Track, and Tennis Also add the reason no funds were expended for TRAVEL in Softball, Cross-Country, Tennis, and Volleyball. Include a copy of the school's Awards policy.

The KHSAA continues to recommend that the Gender Equity Review Committee meet at least once during each sport season: Fall, Winter, and Spring.

   Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of regular season competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event. The reason that travel was not on the report for sports Softball, Cross-Country, Tennis and Volleyball is because the sports were not billed from central office until the end of the 2009-2010 school year. This means that next years report will have two sets of transportation billings. We have finally got the central office to bill us each month rather than at the end of the school year.
