- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.

For Column 1, list the number of interscholastic teams offered for girls and boys at each competitive level (varsity, junior varsity, and freshman). For girls, total each of the entries in Rows 1, 2, and 3 into Row 4. For boys, total Rows 5, 6, and 7 into Row 8.

Plans to Address Interest: Had sign ups and meeting for girls interested in tennis in April 2010. Four girls showed interest and attended meeting. Two of the girls already played a spring sport and would have to drop the other sport to play. We do not have access to Tennis courts (there are none in county). We requested bids to build new courts on campus. The cost was going to be over 120 thousand dollars. Due to initial cost and low numbers of interest, we will be unable to pursue Girls Tennis at this time.
