A copy of the schools awards policy was requested last year but with the new Athletic Director the request was probably misplaced. With that in mind we are requesting a copy of the schools Awards Policy for the second time and requesting that it be sent to the KHSAA by October 1.

Other Recommendation and Comments: From the information given we see that there is not a female student athlete on the Gender Equity Committee. The request was made last year that a female student athlete be placed on the Gender Equity Committee but one is still not listed. The committee need to meet in the very near future to select the young lady that will fill this position and by September 1 a new listing of the members of the 2010-2011 Hopkinsville Gender Equity Committee that will include the name of this female student athlete and her contact information. Overall spending issues is not in the Red Flag area but as you have somewhat suggested getting control of booster spending is imperative.

- Looking at the T35 T36 reposts has a few things that stand out that the Gender Equity Committee needs to sit down to look at and discuss....
 - a. We all know that no one travels free in today's world but this report indicates that zero was spent by the school in Boys Swimming.
 - b. Awards spending continues to be an area that the Gender Equity Committee needs to look at. This report indicates that the Boys and Girls Cross Country, Boys Soccer, Boys and Girls Swimming and Wrestling teams receive no school funding for awards (trophies, banquets, etc.).
 - c. Awards spending in the like sport of basketball when the boys team receives \$1,070.00 more for awards that the girls team. Very much a Red Flag situation.
 - d. Since this is the second year in a row with so many concerns in regard to awards we are asking that the Gender Equity Committee meet soon and re-evaluate and/or create the Hopkinsville High School Athletic Awards Policy and that a copy of this new policy be sent to the KHSAA by September 1, 2010. This Awards issues should very much be reflected in your Corrective Action Plan.
- The Gender Equity Committee needs to look at the female athletic participation at Hopkinsville since your reports the past few years indicate a continuing decline in female athletic participation over the past few years. Try to come up with ideas that will get more of your female students participating.

- Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male.
