*Number of 8th grade students & below used in Column 3 and Column 4 calculations: 4

1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).

- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- 4) Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first **date of regular season competition**, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event. Determine the total number of interscholastic athletics participants that are girls, (and place in Row 1, Column 3). In order to determine the total number of athletics participants, an individual should be counted each time he or she participates on a team. For example, if Jane Doe competes on the varsity volleyball team, the junior varsity volleyball team, and the varsity softball team, she should be counted as four participants (do not include club or intramural sports participants, cheerleaders, dance teams, or pom squads). Calculate the same way for boys and girls. * In addition, should 8th grade students and below play on a Freshman, Junior Varsity, or Varsity team, they should also be counted for each team and sport on which they participate. If applicable, please asterisk in the above notation as to how many 8th grade students & below are included in the totals.

Using the same procedure, determine the total number of interscholastic athletic participants that are boys, (and place in Row 2, Column 3). Add Row 1, Column 3 plus Row 2, Column 3 to get total participants and place in Row 3, Column 3.

5) Calculate the percentage of female participation. (Row 1, Column 3 divided by Row 3, Column 3 and place in Row 1, Column 4.)
 Calculate the percentage of male participation. (Row 2, Column 3 divided by Row 3, Column 3 and place in Row 2, Column 4.) Note: Row 1, Column 4 plus Row 2, Column 4 should total 100%.

Note: While being within three percent is <u>not</u> a formal compliance standard, if the percent listed in Row 1, Column 4 is within 3% of Row 1, Column 2, then it provides a good target within which compliance is likely.

If less than 25%, then compliance with Test Three should be analyzed. <u>CAUTION</u>: 25% is <u>not</u> a formal compliance standard.

- → Introductions were made.

 \rightarrow The AD explained about KHSAA forms requirements. He will do them all first then give them to C.J. Prater to look over to see if there is any need to make any changes or not. The AD explained that he must get all the facts first before working on the forms. It takes him at least 2 weeks to complete all the KHSAA required forms.

→ Discussed KSD Coaches Equity Survey

The AD collected 5 replies from coaches via e-mail. Then he collected 2 more at the meeting. The AD went thru all the surveys and discussed each survey with all the committee members who were present at the meeting.

- 1. For Awards, There are no inequalities in Awards given. We make everything as equal as possible.
- 2. For Equipment, Only one coach reported that the volleyball team needs new knee pads.
- 3. For Facility, there are no concerns.
- 4. For Schedule [Games and/or Practices], Games no concerns.
- 5. For Meals or Transportation, There is one concern about the meals. One coach said that meals will always be an issue but something we have zero control over. The Café people kept on not getting the box meals ready to be picked up on TIME! The AD has reported these incidents several times to the Campus Manager and Principal about this on-going problem. The AD doesn't know if it is already addressed by the administration.
- 6. For Transportation, there are no concerns.
- 7. For Budget, there are no concerns.
- 8. For any suggestions for improvement One coach said we don't need to stop at McDonald's after the games on a long road trip. This causes us to get back to KSD very, very late on school nights. Very hard on the student-athletes (especially the ones who are day students), the coaches who are teachers, and the parents who come to pick their children up. We can stop by convenience stores instead that would save much more time. One coach said I feel that our AD is doing the best he can with what he has.

 \rightarrow Corrective Action Plan: We will follow up on the last year's corrective action plan of purchasing the video camera and digital camera for Athletic Department as we didn't do anything to order the video camera and digital camera last year. We will try to order this year.

There is one corrective action plan needed for next year. The coaches would like to the backboard lights to be installed on the two glass boards in the gym. Also we need to follow the uniforms replacement chart as we need to purchase 2 new different uniforms for each sport – Boys Soccer and Girls Volleyball teams for next fall as soon as possible. We ordered 2 sets of uniforms for Boys basketball team last year and one set for Girls Volleyball team. We need to order one more set of uniform for the Girls Volleyball team soon.
