- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of regular season competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event. ### **FORM T3 ATTACHMENT**

The student survey indicated that on question #2 that 32 girls were interested in playing volleyball. This writer pulled all of those surveys that checked volleyball and found the following information:

- 1. Out of those 32 that checked they were interested in playing volleyball, only 21 checked that as their only sport of interest (as opposed to checking multiple sports that they would like to play in the Fall season)
- 2. Out of those 21, 10 indicated on question #1 that they were satisfied with the School District's current offerings.
- 3. Out of those 21, only 2 indicated that they would be interested in playing volleyball on the intramural level and only 8 of those 21 indicated that they participated in outside activities.
- 4. On question #8, out of those 21, 11 indicated that they currently participate in interscholastic athletics during any season and 9 indicated that they did not participate in any sports with the following reasons: 1 preferred band, chorus, etc.; 1 indicated it was too expensive; 2 would prefer to participate in a club or intramural sport; and 4 indicated that the sport they like isn't offered.

While the survey, at face value, indicates a large number of respondents wanting to have volleyball at our school (32) in reality, this number breaks down as one looks at the answers submitted more closely. We also had a number of 31 participants who indicated they would like to see football at our school and I believe that I would find similar discrepancies should I break this figure down in similar fashion.

As with all small schools, the number of participants on any given athletic team can vary from year to year, and does tend to go in cycles depending on level of interest and numbers of girls. This year has been a struggle for Model's girls teams as while the T1 form indicates 136 total participants, that figure is double and triple counted, wherein some of our teams are so small in number that the girls are asked to play both JV and Varsity (sometimes even freshmen) too and that is relying on middle school students to participate in some cases. There have been times this year that we have had to worry about forfeiting due to lack of numbers, whenever illness or injury hits one of our teams. If girls are asked to choose between volleyball, soccer, golf and cross country, I am not sure that we would have enough participants to field all 4 teams and potentially could end up dropping a program (s).

In addition, our school lost 1 full time teaching position and 2 instructional teacher aide positions this year due to budget cuts, and this financial pinch that all schools are feeling definitely filters to all departments, including athletics. The addition of a new sport at this time, between coaching staff, equipment and uniforms, officials, facility updates, and transportation

would be worrisome as to how we would come up with the funding, and where we would have to take it away from to make it a go.

While it is probably not realistic at this time to add another sport, I would suggest that perhaps we hold a forum in the future for the girls in our school to establish the true level of commitment for adding volleyball as a competitive sport to our school. This might give us a better idea with regard to the feasibility of maintaining 4 Fall sports for girls and allow us time to determine where the cost of such changes can come from.
