

#### **Budget Explanation on Equipment Expenditures**

One obvious discrepancy in equipment expenditures exists when viewing forms T35 and T36.

Boys baseball spent over \$11,000 and girls softball spent just \$3,600. This discrepancy is misleading in that each year the baseball players and parents themselves pay for hats, a pair of pants and jersey that the athletes keep, along with other miscellaneous equipment like bats and gloves. These purchases are run through their school account due to the school's past contract with Nike and the 40% discount offered. Although the softball players are offered this same opportunity, the softball team buys their equipment to last more than one season (bags and pullovers – every other year) and the team size is smaller (baseball = 35, softball = 18). These two elements combined serve to give a misleading view of expenditures between the two programs.



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
