- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- 4) Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first **date of regular season competition**, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event. In order to determine the total number of athletics participants, an individual should be counted each time he or she participates on a team. Our county does not have a bowling alley, tennis courts or indoor swimming pool that would be available for us to use to develop a potential team in any of the above mentioned sports. Nor are there any club/recreational teams available to students in our area. There is no recreational/club soccer league in our county area and the closest one available to our girls would be at least 30 miles away. We will continue to survey our students and if substantial interest is found, we will look for a way to add any of the sports.
