**ATHLETIC TEAMS/BOOSTER TRAVEL GUIDELINES.**

**Travel Guidelines for Athletic events.**

**HOTEL ROOMS:**

- It is recommended that teams place 4 players per room and not to exceed 4 players per room.
- Teams are not to exceed \$150.00 per room for the team members/coaches hotel rooms.

**MODE OF TRANSPORTATION:**

- All KHSAA events/games; Teams shall travel by school bus. Teams will pay for both miles and driver. (Prices set by the local Board of Education).

**CHARTER BUS:**

- If a team chooses to charter a bus from an outside company, it must be pre-approved by the principal and Athletic Director.
- If a team chooses to charter a bus from an outside company, boosters will have to pay the difference in price from school bus to charter bus. (Example; teams will pay what it would cost to take a school bus and boosters would pay remaining balance).

**TRAVEL FOOD:**

- Food Guidelines. If boosters or school pay for the team's meal, then that amount cannot exceed \$40.00 per day for meals or \$25.00 for any one meal per member.

**INDIVIDUAL BANNER POLICY:**

- If any student athlete is named by the KHSAA as Mr. or Miss KY. In a state sponsored sport, then that student will receive a banner placed in the gym at the schools expense.
- (Example Kelsey Pardue, Miss KY softball or Jim McDaniel, Mr. KY basketball).
