3. Describe, in detail, the selection process for each named squad.

During try-outs, girls are given a choice of which team to try-out for. They are told up front that all cheerleaders will cheer for all home football games, alternate on away football games and cheer ½ the boys home games and ½ the girls home games. This method will allow all cheerleaders – whether on the White Varsity or the Blue Varsity to cheer at the same number of football games, same number of girls basketball games, and same number of boys basketball games. In addition - those girls who may like to cheer at games, but are not interested in a competitive squad – will cheer at the same type of games as a cheerleader who is on the competitive Blue Varsity squad. Both the Blue & White Squads only cheer at varsity games. .. no JV or freshmen.

The girls are told that the Blue Varsity is the competition squad and have a minimum requirement for skills and abilities. Girls try-out for the squad of their choice based upon a list of skills that are required.

The number of individuals selected will be determined by the skill level of the candidates trying out that year. Selection of candidates for the White varsity team will also be looking at the same criteria. The White Varsity team may also compete at KAPOS depending upon the number of candidates trying out and their skill level.

4. How is each cheerleading squad assigned to home and away athletic contests? Include football as well as boys' and girls' basketball (and any other sport) at the varsity and junior varsity levels. Include any rotation plans or alternating game assignments that your squads follow.

Both Blue & White Varsity cheer at all home varsity football games and any away game that is "in-town" (Owensboro, Daviess County or Catholic). For all other away varsity football games, the Blue & White Varsity teams shall alternate which team gets to travel.

For basketball – The Blue Varsity will cheer $\frac{1}{2}$ of the boys varsity home basketball games and $\frac{1}{2}$ of the girls varsity home basketball games. The White Varsity will follow the same pattern. For "in-town" away boys and girls basketball games – the Blue and White Varsity will divide those 6 games equally as well. In addition – the Blue and White Varsity shall also divide evenly the "big rivalry" games .
