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TRANSPORTATION / TRAVEL PER DIUM

Athletic programs that participate on off campus practices are provided transportation by the school if needed. Coaches must schedule practices in locations and times where bus routes can accommodate those with transportation needs.

Athletes are allowed to ride home with their parents after a sporting event, but due to insurance requirements they are not allowed to ride home with anyone else, including other parents. Only extreme exceptions may occur and the principal must approve those situations.

Team travel expenses are paid by the Bardstown Board Office for regular season and playoff games. Any additional travel expense is left to the individual sport to make payment.

Overnight stays or bus upgrade costs are to be paid by the individual sport.

State ran tournaments that require overnight stays are paid for by the athletic department. Hotel costs are based upon 3 star accommodations and four athletes to a room.

Meals are provided by the school cafeteria for student athletes that miss a meal because of the time or length of a contest.

Individual sports pay for meals during tournaments not hosted by the state.

The Athletic Department gives meal vouchers for State tournaments.

Coaches are not compensated for mileage or meals for scouting or other trips unless approved by the principal.





Tiger Den Usage

The Tiger Den is a multi- purpose facility used by multiple groups and organizations. The east wing is designated for middle school football, visitors, and softball. The middle section is the weight room and football locker rooms. The west wing is designated for the boys and girls soccer and boys and girls cross-country teams.

Athletic Usage of:

Weight Room:

- The weight room holds daily classes that are a part of the school curriculum.
- All programs have equal access to the weight room facilities.
- Weight room calendar is designated, in the event that there is a conflict in time usage the appropriate teams will refer to a rotation policy created by the Athletic Director.

Locker Rooms:

Fall Sports:

- 1. Football has access to the middle locker room during season.
- 2. The Middle School Football uses the locker room in the east wing.
- 3. The girl's cross-country, uses the locker room through the weight room.
- 4. Girl's and boy's soccer use locker rooms on the west wing

Spring Sports:

- Boys track use the locker room occupied by football in the fall.
- Girls track use the locker room occupied by middle school football in the fall
- Girls tennis use the locker room occupied by girl's cross-country in the fall
- Boys tennis use the locker room occupied by the soccer team in the fall
- Baseball shares the locker room with boys track





High School Gymnasium Usage

- 1. The volleyball team has access to the gym during the fall without restrictions.
- 2. Girls and boy basketball work on alternating days and times for any open gym workouts. Cheerleaders are offered times in the main gym but choose to practice in the primary school gym for consistent starting times and storage.
- 3. During basketball season, the practice schedule times are based on an alternating week schedule. Coaches turn in monthly practice schedule times to the athletic department.
- 4. Spring sports are on a rotating schedule for gym usage during their season. Baseball, softball and tennis rotate which team practices first, second and third when they can't go outside

Locker Rooms:

Fall Sports:

- 1. The East locker room is sued for volleyball in the fall, and girls basketball in the winter.
- 2. The West locker room is used for boys basketball in the winter.
- 3. The front two rooms are PE and visitor locker rooms.
- 4. The Cheerleading room is on the balcony.

Spring Sports:

The softball team uses the west wing locker room.





Bardstown High School "Friends of" Accounts

Bardstown Athletics does not have booster clubs that are separate from the school and run outside of the school system.

Each athletic team has a "Friends of" account that is controlled by the head coach and is run through the school.

Head coaches must complete the Fundraising Authorization Form and submit it to the principal for approval.

The intent of the fundraised money must be determined at the time of the fundraising event.

The head coach must collect all money that is raised and parents can't be the main resource in a fundraising event.

All purchases through "Friends of" accounts must be by the head coach and approved by the principal





BANNER RECOGNITION

Each sporting team has a banner hanging on the gymnasium wall. Every district championship or region runner-up or region championship will be honored on that team banner.

A team that wins a state championship will have a separate state championship banner in the gymnasium.

Individuals who are recognized as national coach or player of the year, McDonald's All-American, or Mr. / Mrs. Kentucky for their particular sport will be honored with a banner in the gymnasium.

should include All-State recognition, All-American recognition, Pro selection, outstanding college
accomplishments, and college scholarship recipient or collegiate participant. Other considerations may
be taken into account but may not take the place of the above criteria.

<u>ALUMNUS/ALUMNA</u>: Any student, after 10 years from graduation, who distinguished himself/herself in the field of athletics after graduation from Bardstown High School/Bardstown Training School.

COACH: Any coach with at least five years of service at Bardstown High School/Bardstown Training School and 15 years of coaching experience. The nominee must be inactive to be eligible for consideration. Criteria consideration should be based on accomplishments that merit statewide recognition as well as significant contributions to the athletic programs at Bardstown High School/Bardstown Training School.

CONTRIBUTOR: An individual who has made outstanding contributions to the interscholastic athletic programs at Bardstown High School/Bardstown Training School other than coaching and playing.
