Tryouts are in April of each year. All interested students are given three (3) days of instruction. Each student is instructed in a cheer, dance, show tumbling, jumps and stunts. On the fourth day try-outs are held where each individual is score on the categories listed above. Judges that are not affiliated with Calloway County are brought in to judge. The highest 20 individual scores make the varsity squad and the next highest 10 make the JV squad.

4. How is each cheerleading squad assigned to home and away athletic contests? Include football as well as boys' and girls' basketball (and any other sport) at the varsity and junior varsity levels. Include any rotation plans or alternating game assignments that your squads follow.

The JV squad only cheers for home JV football games and home boys and girls JV basketball games. The Varsity squad cheers for all varsity football games. The Varsity squad also cheers for all home Varsity boys and girls basketball games. For varsity basketball away games, the varsity squad is divided into their stunt groups. Two groups are randomly selected for each away Varsity girls or boys game so that all groups get equal opportunities and equal number of boy and girl games.

 attend camp at a college campus. Also, column 8 is much greater for the grilse tam
 because of a \$17,000 pre-payment for a competition trip via air to Orlando, Florida
 planned for December 2010.
- 2. Girls Softball expenses in column 5 are greater than Boys Baseball due to the purchase of new uniforms. Also, expenses in column 8 are greater for softball than baseball because softball participated in several in-season tournaments and their boosters paid for motels and meals. Baseball did not stay overnight at motels and did not pay for team meals.
- 3. Girls Soccer had significantly higher expenditures in column 5 than Boys Soccer due to over \$1,000 worth of soccer balls provided to Girls Soccer from the booster club (apparently for soccer camp). Also, while not reflected on this report as an expense, the players/parents reimbursed the boosters for \$4,000 spent for the girls to attend soccer camp at the University of Louisville.
