

# Casey County High School Athletics Travel Policy

The following is the travel policy for Casey County High School Athletics:

1 - All head coaches shall complete the appropriate travel form and turn into athletic director no less than 30 days prior to the first scrimmage date for their sport. The athletic director will sign the travel form and send to board for approval and to CCPS Transportation Department personnel.

2 - Busses are the only form of travel for outside contests approved by the Casey County Board of Education.

3 - Any overnight trip requires special board approval. Coaches should keep in mind that on any overnight trip at least one coach must be certified in Medicine Administration per state law.

4 - All meals and lodging for regular season and non- state championship road trips will be paid for from booster club funds or by the students or parents themselves.

When staying on an overnight trip the hotel must have no more than four students per room. Athletes must stay in rooms in interior corridors of lodging facilities for safety purposes.

The athletic director must approve all bookings of hotels previous to them being finalized in order to ensure gender equity.

If the meal is paid for by booster club funds it is not to exceed \$10 per athlete. If the meal is paid for by parents or students then there is no limitation. This is for both male and female athletes.

While it is understandable that like teams may have more road games than that of their counterpart we want to work to ensure that like sports have no more than a 3 meal differential for regular season contests.

For KHSAA State Championship competition the hotel rooms for all competing athletes will be paid for by athletic funds in accordance with above stipulations. This is the same for both boys and girls teams.

For KHSAA State Championship competition each athlete will be allowed a \$10 per diem for one meal over the span of the entire event paid for by athletic department funds. This is the same for both boys and girls teams.

## Casey County High School Athletics Uniform Ordering and Rotation Policy

The game uniforms for Casey County High School Athletic teams will be purchased according to the following rotation policy:

1 - All uniform purchases from athletic funds or booster funds must be approved by athletic director prior to purchase.

2 - The following four year rotation is for uniforms purchased from athletic department funds:

Year 1 (2017-18)

Baseball and Softball home and away

Boys and Girls Track/Cross Country (one set)

Year 2 (2018-19)

Boys and Girls Soccer home and away

Volleyball Home and Away

Year 3 (2019-2020)

Boys and Girls Basketball home and away

Year 4 (2020-2021)

Football Home and Away

\*The above sports in the rotation will only be allowed to purchase one set of uniforms per scheduling cycle from their booster club or non-athletic department monies. For every set of uniforms purchased out of non-athletic funds above the one set max then that particular program will forego one uniform set to be purchased from athletic department funds for their next place in the cycle.

3 - The following sports will be able to purchase one new set of uniforms every year from their booster club or non-athletic department monies. However, uniform purchases must be equitable to both male and female participants.

Tennis - one set each year for both boys and girls

Golf - one set each year for both boys and girls

Bass Fishing - one set each year for entire squad

Baseball and Softball - Caps and Visors only.

Cheerleading - two sets each year for entire squad

\*It is possible that the athletic department could help fund uniforms for these sports. However, if this is chosen then they will be inserted into the above rotation on the year in which uniforms are needed and the uniforms will then be used for four years and remain with the program each year.

# Casey County High School Athletics Policy for Jersey Retirement and Banners

The following are the athlete recognition policies for Casey County High School:

## **Jersey Retirement:**

### Nomination Process-

1 - Nominations are to be in writing to the athletic director and the gender equity committee.

In order for a candidate to be considered for jersey retirement the following criteria must be met:

A - Must have graduated from Casey County High School (or a high school in Casey County if the athlete is from the time period of pre-consolidation).

B - Athlete must be out of school no less than 10 years after graduation.

C - Athlete must have been honored as at least an All-Area performer if they played from 1988 to the present.

Once nominations are approved by the athletic director and the gender equity committee then they will go to the Athletic Honors Board for the 75% vote needed to retire the jersey.

Special Consideration will be given to candidates who have achieved the following:

- 1 - All-State Status as a high school athlete
- 2 - Excelled at the college level
- 3 - Played professionally
- 4 - Were tops in statistical categories
- 5 - Brought significant positive recognition to CCHS

\*Jersey Retirement does NOT constitute number retirement for that particular sport.

\*Jerseys of current student-athletes may be honored during the season for death or other significant events. Approval for this must be given by the CCHS Principal and Athletic Director.

## **Individual Player Banners**

\*The only individual player banners for current players that may be hung at the home game site are those of current senior players. If a team chooses to hang banners of their current senior players then they must have one for each senior player. The hanging of player banners is in no way mandatory for any program and it to be at the coaches discretion. Banners will be paid for through boosters for each individual team.

### **Player Honors**

\*At CCHS the following exist for player honors:

1 - There will be banners for the top scorers for both the boys and girls basketball team that hang in the gymnasium.

2 - In the field house weight room there are boards for the top lifts in school history and for individual football honors (all-district, all-area, all-state).

3 - At the track there is a board for the school records by event in the track and field program.

4 - Coaches may use their locker room areas to begin boards that honor individual accomplishment by statistic or accolades. However, if information is not present for the entirety of the program's life span then that **MUST** be noted on the board or banner.

\*\*\*The Athletic Department will pay for changes to banners and boards.
