One week is set aside usually in April for cheer practice and tryouts. All girls interested in being on the cheerleading squad signs up for tryouts in the main office. Senior members of present squad (will graduate) teach cheers and routines that cheerleaders will be judged on. Certified KAPOs judges are hired by the Athletic Department to judge tryouts. Those receiving top scores will be selected as the cheer squad for the next school year.

4. How is each cheerleading squad assigned to home and away athletic contests? Include football as well as boys' and girls' basketball (and any other sport) at the varsity and junior varsity levels. Include any rotation plans or alternating game assignments that your squads follow.  
The Varsity cheerleading Squad will cheer for all football games, Home and away, and will cheer for all home boys varsity basketball games and all home girls varsity basketball games. On occasion the cheerleaders may travel to an away game of a nearby school such as South Laurel, Whitley County or Williamsburg. If they travel to a boys game they will travel to the same number of girls games. Cheerleaders cheer at all post season tournaments.

5. Name any squad(s) that takes part in competitive cheerleading events.  
Varsity Cheerleading Squad
