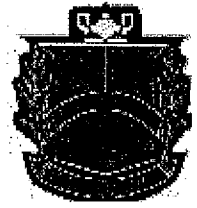

Frankfort High School is in an unique situation with our athletic facilities in that we are truly land locked. We own our basketball gym which sits off campus and we own our football facility that sits off campus. All of our other facilities we either lease from the state or pay a usage fee. Three to four years ago our softball team used to play at Lakeview Park on the East side of the town. That field had lights. The district made the decision three or four years ago to move the softball field down into Capital View Park where our baseball team currently plays. The fields are side by side (baseball field does have lights; softball field does not have lights). While we do not own the fields at Capital View they are considered Frankfort High Fields. No one else uses them during the season but other teams (youth league) do have access to each field in the off-seasons. The parks do the general maintenance on the fields and they do have them ready on game days. We do pay the parks department of Frankfort a \$25 rental fee on game days. We typically get this at the end of the season in one large invoice. Needless to say we (Frankfort High School) do not have a large amount of money in our athletic budgets but we do attempt to cover this cost for the teams.

We have had a parent do some complaining about the Title IX issue of the boys having lights and the girls not having them. We have had this on our Title IX report for the last few years as an area of improvement/need. I have been in discussion with MUSCO lighting and gotten an estimate to have new lights installed. Frankfort High Schools concern is that we invest a large amount of money into lights on a field that we do not own. Who is to say that in the near future we lose that field and we are then out the cost of the lights as well (not just that easy to take them down). I have encourage our softball coaches that I/we (Frankfort High School) would help out in fundraising anyway possible but for our small district to raise the amount of money needed for a project like that would take a considerable amount of time.

Frankfort Independent is currently in the process of looking at developing a facility that may house Football/Soccer/Baseball/Softball all in one area and that would also include new lighting for the entire complex. We have also started discussion about the possibility of using Lakeview Fields for a few games (have to work around Kentucky State University softball games and recreational league games through the Frankfort Parks Department).

While this may not be the best scenario that is the only things we can do at this point. We will continue to explore all options and attempt to make things equitable for our softball players.

### **Guidelines for Banners, Travel and Per Diem**

We have banners hanging in the gym for ALL sports that win District, Region Runner-up, Regional Winner, State Champion and State Runner up. We have them for teams and State Champions recognitions for Individuals. We have the ability to "Add Years" as the accomplishments are achieved.

We also recognize all 1000 point scorers for Boys and Girls basketball players.

Any student athlete recognized by the KHSAA will also receive a banner hanging in the gym with their accomplishments.

### **Pier Diem/Overnight Stay**

Each sport can make an overnight trip as long as they have prior approval from the Board of Education. The sport must make a written request and present to the BOE. For the overnight trips each sport is responsible for paying for the trip. Expenses such as rooms and meals will come out of the sports athletic budget. Meals will either be provided by the school (out of the sports budget) or paid by each individual player. Rooms must fall between \$75-\$100 a night, unless the tournament that they are attending provides the rooms at a discounted rate or free. Each room shall have a minimum of 3 players and a maximum of 5 players/managers per room. Coaching staff must share a room as well.

Meals provided by the school for the athlete should follow the following guidelines:

Breakfast \$7.00

Lunch \$8.00

Supper \$12.00
