 - C. Practice session for cheerleaders to demonstrate, practice cheers/skills.
 - D. Try outs closed to public/students. Judges assist coach/sponsor select best cheerleaders. The Judges help to give objective input and they add a fairness value.
 - E. Cheerleaders selected on merit based on skills, cheering, and performance.
 - F. The number selected to cheer is determined by the coach/sponsor.
4. How is each cheerleading squad assigned to home and away athletic contests? Include football as well as boys' and girls' basketball (and any other sport) at the varsity and junior varsity levels. Include any rotation plans or alternating game assignments that your squads follow.

The Varsity Cheerleading Squad cheers at all home games (football and basketball). Since there are more basketball games, the cheerleaders rotate boys and girls games. They are usually divided to give one group a rest period. While divided, they are still a Varsity squad. On selected away (rival team) games, the cheerleaders perform. The cheerleaders do not cheer at the junior varsity level.
