They are given a score sheet and each girl comes out and performs the required skills. They have had a workshop ahead of time to learn a chant and cheer that each girl will perform. The scores are then totaled and the top 15 scores are on the team. If an alternate is chosen, the next higher score is taken.

4. How is each cheerleading squad assigned to home and away athletic contests? Include football as well as boys' and girls' basketball (and any other sport) at the varsity and junior varsity levels. Include any rotation plans or alternating game assignments that your squads follow.

They alternate by stunt groups. They cheer the same amount of home/away and boy/girl game. Everyone cheers at home on Friday nights. Includes basketball games only.

We have 1 squad and they participate in competition events. This is the same squad we have in basketball.
