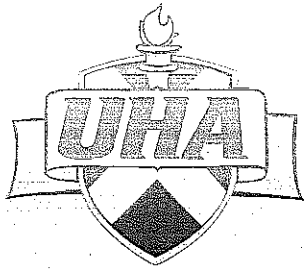

Mr. Lawson's guidance in this process has been very helpful. We welcome suggestions to improve our athletic program. Please let me know if additional information is required.

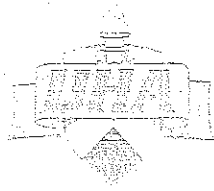

Transportation

Two buses are available to transport students to competitions. The fuel cost is absorbed by the school; however, teams are responsible for the cost of the driver.

Teams advancing to a state tournament have the option of charter bus at team expense.

Meals

Food expenses include meals at \$8.00/meal/student.

Housing

Mid to moderate/upper price (Market price) i.e. La Quinta, Comfort Inn, Hampton Inn

Three students per room.

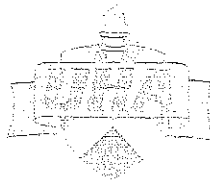
Preference is given to hotels with free continental breakfast.

The Board recognizes that a significant part of interscholastic athletics is the recognition of achievement by student-athletes. All teams shall hold an end-of-season recognition ceremony/banquet where student achievement is recognized. Each individual sport shall establish written criteria used to determine varsity letter awards. **The criteria shall be clearly defined and communicated in writing to the team members at the beginning of the season.** All athletes will receive a certificate of participation. Coaches may give awards based on season statistics. Typically, seniors will also receive special acknowledgement gifts such as a collage of action photos or memory book.
