



Dear Cassandra H. Webb:

Pursuant to 702 KAR 7:065, the Kentucky High School Athletic Association has been directed to assist member schools in monitoring compliance with Title IX. Part of this assessment process includes reviewing the progress schools are making with their Gender Equity Review Committees and Title IX plans. Twenty percent of the KHSAA membership will be visited this year, and subsequent years until every school has been visited. KHSAA Audit Staff members may be accompanied by KDE personnel on these visits.

We have scheduled March 10th as the audit date for Lawrence County High School. The audit will begin at 2:30 P.M., and will consist of the following, in this order:

- The Athletic Director or school representative should be prepared to accompany the KHSAA auditors on a tour of all athletic facilities, including all locker rooms, all meeting rooms, coaches' offices, storage facilities, all practice and competition areas, and any other facility used by the athletic department.
- On display for the KHSAA auditors to review should be examples of team uniforms from each boys' and girls' athletic team.
- The KHSAA auditors will meet with your school's Gender Equity Review Committee
 at approximately 4:00 P.M. All committee members, if possible, should be in attendance,
 particularly your school's Title IX Coordinator. During this meeting, the KHSAA auditors
 will discuss your athletic program in detail. Your Gender Equity Review Committee
 should be prepared with pertinent information pertaining to your school's original 19992000 Audit Document and updated 2001-2002 Title IX forms.
- The KHSAA auditors will conduct a public comment session at 6:00 P.M. for the
 purpose of allowing any interested parties the opportunity to ask questions regarding
 gender equity and Title IX, as well as the overall athletics program at your school.
 Members of your administrative staff and representatives of your Title IX Committee
 should be present for this session. The KHSAA will alert the local media of this session
 in order to notify interested parties who may wish to attend.
