During two week window in spring (generally April) one week is designated for football squad and the 2nd is designated for basketball squad. Open to all girls in grades 8-11 in the school system. Tryouts are promoted through school announcements, local radio announcements, newspaper articles and contact with middle school cheer sponsors.

Generally there are two practice days and one day of tryouts. School brings in outside judges who have no connection with the school. Participants are scored based on recommendations, stunts, cheers and dances (for basketball tumbling is added). The top 14 in football and 16 in basketball are selected. The next two scorers in line are considered alternates should one of the top 14/16 decide not to cheer.

Participants can try out for one or both squads. This was done to allow girls who wanted to work part-time the opportunity to still have a chance to cheer. In addition, this allows girls who play either a fall / winter sport the opportunity to also cheer for a sport outside their other sport's season.

Boy's (if sufficient interest is shown) are allowed to try out for either squad however there generally has been limited interest.

Basketball squad only. This is made plainly clear in tryout packets given to interested students.

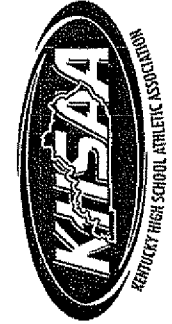




Generally there are two practice days and one day of tryouts. School brings in outside judges who have no connection with the school. Participants are scored based on recommendations, stunts, cheers and dances (for basketball tumbling is added). The top 14 in football and 16 in basketball are selected. The next two scorers in line are considered alternates should one of the top 14/16 decide not to cheer.

Participants can try out for one or both squads. This was done to allow girls who wanted to work part-time the opportunity to still have a chance to cheer. In addition, this allows girls who play either a fall / winter sport the opportunity to also cheer for a sport outside their other sport's season.

Boy's (if sufficient interest is shown) are allowed to try out for either squad however there generally has been limited interest.

Generally there are two practice days and one day of tryouts. School brings in outside judges who have no connection with the school. Participants are scored based on recommendations, stunts, cheers and dances (for basketball tumbling is added). The top 14 in football and 16 in basketball are selected. The next two scorers in line are considered alternates should one of the top 14/16 decide not to cheer.

Participants can try out for one or both squads. This was done to allow girls who wanted to work part-time the opportunity to still have a chance to cheer. In addition, this allows girls who play either a fall / winter sport the opportunity to also cheer for a sport outside their other sport's season.

Boy's (if sufficient interest is shown) are allowed to try out for either squad however there generally has been limited interest.





During two week window in spring (generally April) one week is designated for football squad and the 2nd is designated for basketball squad. Open to all girls in grades 8-11 in the school system. Tryouts are promoted through school announcements, local radio announcements, newspaper articles and contact with middle school cheer sponsors.

Generally there are two practice days and one day of tryouts. School brings in outside judges who have no connection with the school. Participants are scored based on recommendations, stunts, cheers and dances (for basketball tumbling is added). The top 14 in football and 16 in basketball are selected. The next two scorers in line are considered alternates should one of the top 14/16 decide not to cheer.

Participants can try out for one or both squads. This was done to allow girls who wanted to work part-time the opportunity to still have a chance to cheer. In addition, this allows girls who play either a fall / winter sport the opportunity to also cheer for a sport outside their other sport's season.

Boy's (if sufficient interest is shown) are allowed to try out for either squad however there generally has been limited interest.
