#### ATHLETIC ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Ludlow Board of Education and Ludlow High School are responsible for the welfare of all students and student athletes. Ludlow High School along with the Board of Education works to comply with all Title IX compliances. Ludlow High School has developed a policy to recognize the athletic accomplishments for all male and female athletes. The policy is designed to recognize individual and team athletic accomplishments.

The following policy is for: Football, Girls Soccer, Girls Cross Country, Boys Cross Country, Volleyball, Girls Basketball, Boys Basketball, Softball, Baseball, Girls Track, Boys Track, and Cheerleading

- 1. Each player will be given a certificate and an "L" or bar at the team's sports awards banquet. A player will receive an "L" if it is the second year that they have received a varsity letter (meaning they played two seasons of a varsity sport). A player will receive a varsity bar their first, third and fourth year of receiving a varsity letter. A Junior Varsity bar will be given to each athlete who played JV and did not receive a varsity bar. Each freshman who participates at the freshman level will be given a freshman bar.
- 2. Ludlow High School purchases three trophies for each athletic team which will be given away at the team banquet. It is up to the discrepancy of the coach on how he/she awards these trophies. However, no team is permitted to give away more than three trophies.
- 3. Ludlow Athletic Boosters will purchase a varsity letter jacket for any student who has received a varsity letter twice in the same sport. The student athlete must be at least a sophomore and have received the varsity letter in the same sport.
- 4. When athletic teams win Conference championships, districts, regionals, and state, the school will put the years on the banners that are hanging in the gym. Ludlow High School will also purchase a plaque with the team's picture to be hung in the gymnasium lobby.

#### TEAM TROPHIES

- Current year trophies that are won by teams are placed in the cafeteria trophy case so that all students can see the student-athletes/teams accomplishments.
- At the end of the year, we re-adjust based on space and move the trophies to the gymnasium trophy cases.

### END OF THE SEASON RECOGNITION BANQUET

Three times a year the Ludlow High School Athletic Department in cooperation with the Ludlow High School Athletic Boosters will host a banquet to recognize students who participated in a sport. Each banquet will be held in the cafeteria. At the conclusion of the banquet, the Athletic Boosters will provide cake and punch for the

athletes and their families. The amount of money that is spent on each banquet should not exceed \$500.00.

1. There will be two categories for inductees.

#### a. FORMER ATHLETES MEETING THE FOLLOWING CRITERIA

- 1. A graduate of Ludlow High School
- 2. Eligible ten years after graduation

#### b. COACHES AND CONTRIBUTIONS

- 1. The selection of these individuals should be at the discretion of the selection committee. Selection should be based on the criteria of longevity of service and dedication to Ludlow High School Athletics.
- 2. Coaches and contributors to be nominated one year in advance and voted upon the following year. Only one nominee any given year requirement of 80% of selection committee. A coach or contributor shall enter the Ludlow High School Sports Hall of Fame as a honorary member conferred for the sake of honor only.
- 2. Hall of Fame Committee to consist of twelve board members. All potential board members accepted by 80% vote of board members.
- 3. Only five former athletes to be inducted into the Hall of Fame any given year. EXCEPTION: In the event of a tie for the fifth inductee, all will be inducted.
- 4. Any change in the number of former Athletes inducted in any given year, will be at the discretion of the selection committee at an 80% vote.
- 5. All nominees with a past history criteria are eligible for induction any given year.
- 6. All nominees must have a history criteria before being voted upon.
- 7. All applications for new nominees to be received by May 30<sup>th</sup> year of selection.
- 8. All eligible nominees to be voted on and selected no later than July 30<sup>th</sup> year of selection.

9. Nominees for induction shall be voted upon by the following procedure:

Selection ten nominees from eligible list and use the following point system

- 10 Points for your #1 Choice
- 9 Points for your #2 Choice
- 8 Points for your #3 Choice
- 7 Points for your #4 Choice
- 6 Points for your #5 Choice

- 4 Points for your #7 Choice
- 3 Points for your #8 Choice
- 2 Points for your #9 Choice
- 1 Point for your #10 Choice

All ten nominees are now eligible for selection of final five inductees.

- 10. The final five inductees will be selected into the Ludlow High School Sports Hall of Fame from the list of ten selected nominees by the following procedure:
  - 5 Points for your #1 Choice
  - 4 Points for your #2 Choice
  - 3 Points for your #3 Choice
  - 2 Points for your #4 Choice
  - 1 Point for your #5 Choice

FIVE with most votes inducted.

#### ATHLETIC BOOSTERS CLUB AGREEMENT

This agreement is enter into by and between the Ludlow Independent Schools and an entity know as Ludlow Athletic Boosters. Through this agreement, the parties intend to set forth the terms and conditions under which the Booster Club may operate and associate with students, teachers, coaches, and school administrators at Ludlow High School.

The Ludlow Athletic Boosters acknowledge that they must work with Ludlow High School to comply with Title IX compliance. Ludlow High School and the Ludlow Athletic Boosters have come to the following agreements:

- 1. The Ludlow Athletic Boosters will sponsor the Fall, Winter, and Spring Athletic Banquets for all boys and girls athletic teams. The Athletic Boosters will be in charge of the refreshments.
- 2. The Ludlow Athletic Boosters will purchase a letter jacket for any student athlete or cheerleader who is at least a sophomore and who receives a varsity letter in the same sport for two years.
- 3. The Ludlow Athletic Boosters will provide a concession stand for all home football games, soccer games, and boys and girls basketball games. The Athletic Boosters may ask for volunteers but the boosters are responsible for the concessions.
- 4. The Ludlow Athletic Boosters may give periodic donations to help upgrade the athletic facilities. However, the donation must be reviewed and accepted by administration of Ludlow High School in order to comply with Title IX. The money will be used at the discrepancy of the administration in order to not only comply with Title IX but also to better the athletics facilities of Ludlow High School.
- 5. The Ludlow Athletic Boosters may donate money to teams for items/supplies needed.

  However, all request for the boosters go through the Athletic Directors before being passed on to the boosters as to make sure Ludlow High School stays in compliance with Title IX.
- 6. The Ludlow Athletic Boosters must turn in annual reports no later than June 30% to the Athletic Directors and principal for review.
