Our previous Title IX T-32 financial report pertaining to equipment expenditures for boys golf (\$10,409), girls golf (\$3357), baseball (\$14,813), and softball (\$4668) were incorrect. Upon reviewing those numbers, it was found that equipment spending was miscalculated. The chart below shows each individual equipment expenditure from the sports in question from both the school and booster accounts. The corrected totals are calculated at the bottom. Although the corrected totals still show a sizeable discrepancy between baseball and softball, it is worth noting that baseball was up for a uniform rotation during the year in question. The uniform expenditures for baseball are highlighted in italicized bold print in the chart below.





Our previous Title IX report pertaining to the coaching stipends for baseball and softball were reported in error. We had previously reported that the district spent \$7774 on four (4) baseball coaches and \$3274 for three (3) softball coaches for the 2014-15 season. These numbers are incorrect. Attached is the spreadsheet showing current coaching stipends for each sport. Both our baseball (Tom Posey) and softball (Tony Faul) head coaches receive a \$2000 stipend. Each also receives a \$50 per year step increase. The board also provided one \$1000 stipend for assistant coaches, also with a \$50 step increase per year. As you will see on the attached report, both head coaches have used that particular stipend to split with two assistants.

PURPOSE

To recognize team and individual accomplishments which are sponsored by Mason Co High School. The Mason County High School Athletic Department shall provide administrative oversight to ensure equivalence in the area of recognition.

Whose uspensible?

CRITERIA

Awards are presented to student-athletes who by having regularly participated in team practices and contests has successfully completed the sport season. Therefore, an athlete who has been dismissed from the team for failure to abide by school and team expectations or quits before the end of the season will not receive awards or recognition. Coaches of each sport will determine the appropriate awards and the recipients of those awards. Recipients will include Varsity and JV players. Criteria may change from year to year based on coaches' discretion. A Varsity letter requires participation in a majority of scheduled contests and practices (unless deemed unable to participate due to injury).

PROTOCOL

Coaches of each boys and girls sport will decide on the types, categories, and numbers of individual plaques/awards he/she will present and complete the correct purchase order form. This also applies to banquets that may be held off-campus. The purchase order is to be approved by the Athletic Director and/or Principal before following through with the actual order. The AD and/or Principal will serve as an oversight to the purchasing of awards/plaques/trophies.

PRESENTATIONS

All respective teams and coaches will hold awards presentations/banquets and the culmination of post-season play. All athletic awards will be presented by that sport's coach. School facilities will be open to awards banquets.

FUNDING

All letters, service bars, and insignias will be purchased by the Athletic Director. Plaques, trophies, and other awards will be purchased through the individual sports accounts. If a coach wishes to present such an award or any other recognition that is not part of the Athletic Budget, he/she must confer with the Athletic Director.




