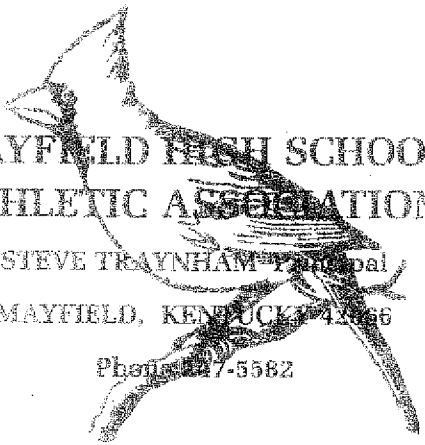

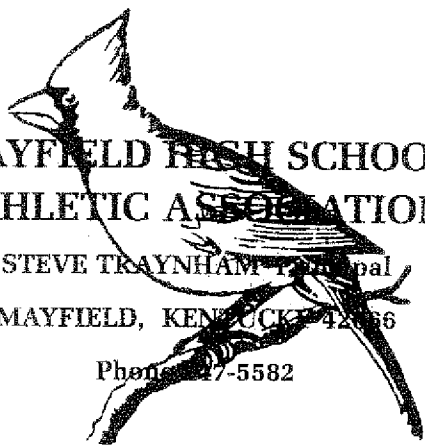



Mayfield Independent School System Cheerleader Guidelines

- I. **MEMBERSHIP:** Cheerleaders will be selected to serve for one year. All candidates must have written permission from their parent/guardian completed before tryouts.

MAYFIELD MIDDLE SCHOOL: Any student who has completed grade six or seven may be eligible to try out.

MAYFIELD HIGH SCHOOL: Any student in grades 9-12 are eligible to try out.

As in other sports, a team or squad cannot function without enough students to participate. In the case of a cheerleader moving from the school district or being unable to fulfill her cheerleading duties for the remainder of the school year, the coach may refer to the tryout score sheets and replace said cheerleader with another candidate. Whether or not the position is filled is left up to the coach of that particular squad and the administration of the school. Students wishing to try out for cheerleader must meet the academic standards of KHSAA and must meet the cheerleading skills criteria of the coach, in order to become a member of the squad. Selection must be completed before the beginning of the fall semester of the school year.

II. ELECTION

1. The time and date for tryouts will be set by the administration.
2. The number of cheerleaders on any particular squad may be changed at the discretion of the principal and the cheerleading coach.
3. Each candidate will be expected to perform individually and as a group before a panel of judges.
4. Each candidate will be required to execute one cheer, one sideline chant, a pom-pom routine and gymnastic stunts.

5. The candidates will draw numbers for the positions in tryouts to determine the order in which they will perform their cheers and routines.

III. SELECTION

1. Selection for the cheerleading squad will be made by a panel of judges and teacher recommendations.
 2. Students from grades nine through twelve will be selected for the Mayfield High School squad.
 3. Students from grades seven and eight will be selected for the Mayfield Middle School squad.

IV. RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Practice sessions:
 - a. Practice sessions will be scheduled for after school and when needed on evenings and weekends.
 - b. All cheerleaders will be present at all practice sessions except in case of emergencies such as illness, illness in the family, or doctor's or dentist's appointments that cannot be scheduled at any other time. Students WILL NOT be excused to go to work. The coach MUST be notified in advance if the cheerleader is going to be absent from any practice. Failure to report missing a practice to the coach will result in recording of a minor infraction.
2. Games
 - a. Cheerleaders must arrive at sporting events prior to the start of the game. The time of arrival is at the discretion of the cheerleading coach.
 - b. Tardiness, if anticipated, or absence from a game should be reported to the coach at least one hour prior to game or the departure of the bus if the game is away.

- c. The student cannot cheer a game if unable to attend school for $\frac{1}{2}$ of that school day.
- d. All cheerleaders are expected to be present for all sporting events if physically able to be out, even if they are unable to cheer.

3. Transportation

- a. Transportation to out of town games and performances will be provided by the Mayfield Board of Education. The rules governing the cheerleader riding the bus is at the discretion of the coach, athletic director and principal of the particular school.
- b. Cheerleaders will be under the supervision of the coach of her particular squad and/or other school certified personnel for all away games and performances.

4. Eligibility

- a. Cheerleaders must maintain passing grades in all core subjects throughout the year.
- b. If at any time during school, or when the student is representing the school, they behave in such a manner that the coach and the school principal deem it necessary, the student will be suspended from leading cheers at one or more games.

5. Uniforms and cheer accessories

- a. Any parts of the uniforms issued to the cheerleader that are reusable will remain property of Mayfield High School/Mayfield Middle School.
- b. At the conclusion of the cheering season, all uniforms **MUST** be turned in to the coach. The uniforms **MUST** be clean and on hangers.

- c. Any uniform or cheer accessory (poms, megaphones, clothing bags) which are not returned to the coach must be paid for by the cheerleader or parent. The cost of the item will be determined by current catalog prices as that item will have to be replaced at current prices.

6. Duties of a cheerleader

- a. Attend all practices, games, performances and planned activities (such as fund-raisers and community service events). If the cheerleader cannot attend any of the above mentioned events, except in case of illness, injury or family emergency, they will be expected to be benched for the following game. (Ex: Trips with groups other than school sponsored events) Coaches must be notified of the absence from a game or event prior to game day. *Exceptions will be made for events that fall during holiday breaks from the regular school calendar. Coaches and school administrators have the final approval of otherwise unexcused absences. If benched for a game, cheerleader will sit, in uniform, in the stands (can be with coach) and support her squad.
- b. Attend cheerleading camp with the entire squad.
- c. Be on time for all practices, games, performances and planned activities.
- d. Meet financial obligations on time.
- e. Carry out assignments such as making signs, school announcements, radio spots, etc.
- f. Be responsible for all school-owned equipment.
- g. Participate in fund-raising projects.
- h. Abide by rules governing cheerleaders.
- i. Participation in some type of gymnastic instruction from either private or public instructors is highly recommended.

7. Duties of parent/guardians

- a. Provide all personal items such as shoes, socks, briefs, bodysuits, etc.
- b. Provide transportation to games and activities that are held at "home". Coaches are not responsible for cheerleaders after game time for "home" games or performances.
- c. Provide camp expenses.

8. Responsibilities of the squad

- a. Cheerleading squads at MHS will be responsible for cheering JV and Varsity football and basketball games. (Cheering for freshman events are at the discretion of the cheerleading coaches.)
- b. The games to be cheered by all the squad or a portion of the squad will be decided by the coaches.

9. Selection of captains

- a. Selection of captains for the MMS squad and MHS squads is left up to the cheerleading coach of that particular squad.
- b. The captain is responsible for duties that are assigned to her by the coach. This may be different for each squad depending on their needs.
