### SY 2004-05

### Item A

- 1. Need to Increase Number of Female Participants.
- 2. The GEC will form a committee, headed by the AD and composed of head coaches of female ports, to discuss this concern.
- 3. The AD will convene the committee before the end of the 2004-2005 school year and report to the GEC at the first meeting of the 2005-06 school year.

### Item B

- 1. Inventory of Equipment and Supplies
- 2. The A.D. will design and distribute an inventory to coaches of all sports for completion.
- 3. Inventory will be distributed immediately and reviewed at the first GEC meeting of 2005-2006.

### Item C

- 1. Evidence of Inequity in the Boys and Girls Basketball Programs.
- 2. Both coaches will devise lists of benefits they would like to provide to their players. Principal Bill Adams and the AD will review and evaluate the lists before deciding how to fund them.
- 3. The coaches will present lists to AD by 5/1/05. Budgets for these two programs will be effective as of 7/1/05.

### SY 2005-06

### Item A

- 1. Coverage of Girls Sports in Local Newspapers
- 2. The AD will meet with the editors of the local newspapers to discuss the "perceived" inequity. As a follow-up, he will ask coaches to cooperate with the efforts of the sports' writers
- 3. As of 3/24/06, the AD has met with both editors and received an extremely cooperative response. Beginning with the Spring Sport Season, the coverage has been much more equitable.

### Item B

- 1. Continued Inequality in Boys and Girls Basketball Programs
- 2. Although the disparity of spending (approximately \$26,000 in '04 '05) has been reduced to \$5,780, the GEC will still monitor the situation. Principal Bill Adams and the AD will meet with the coaches to close this gap.
- 3. This meeting will take place by May 15, 2006 and all efforts will be on-going.

### Item C

- 1. Continued Concern for Female Participation
- 2. In spite of several and varied steps taken to increase the number of female participants, as a result of the 2004-25 Corrective Action Plan, the GEC still has a desire to do all that is possible to increase this number.
- 3. The AD will meet with the Head Coaches of the Female Sports to consider additional ways to raise the number. The meeting will take place by May 15, 2006.

### SY 2006-07

### Item A

- 1. Possible Addition of Slow-Pitch to Athletic Program
- 2. Since Slow-Pitch has been indicated on the Student Surveys as a "Sport of Interest", the GEC wanted to investigate this possibility and asked the AD to contact the KHSAA to see if it was a viable sport and one that other schools are interested in adding.
- 3. The KHSAA was contacted prior to May 1, 2007, and informed the AD that Slow Pitch was no

longer a viable sport.

### Item B

- 1. Media Coverage of Female Sports
- 2. Since the 2005-06 Title IX Report, a new paper has started in the county. The GEC wished to convey to the editors the concern for equitable coverage of all sports. The AD was also directed to express appreciation to the others for the improvements in their coverage of the female sports.
- 3. This contact was to be completed by April 15, 2007.

### Item C

- 1. Prime Time Scheduling of Girls' Basketball
- 2. The AD had been told previously by the KHSAA that Prime Time evaluations would be on a two-year cycle. However, this proved not be true. In order to reach the required 40% mandate, the AD worked with the Head Coach to schedule an additional Saturday game with and added monetary inducement.
- 3. The Girls' Basketball Schedule was completed by June 1, 2007, with a total of 9 home games and 4 on Fridays and Saturdays (44%).

### SY 2001-2002

### Item A

- 1. Prime Time Scheduling of Girls' Basketball Games
- 2. The AD will work more closely with the two head basketball coaches to reach an equal number of games scheduled on Fridays and Saturdays.
- 3. The goal was to see improvement immediately, beginning with the '02-'03 season. However, many of those contract were already written. The most obvious action is to view this as an ongoing concern which will need continuous monitoring.

### Item B

- 1. The Development of Written Policies Relevant to Compliance with Title IX.
- 2. The AD will work with all head coaches to develop the following policies:
  - a. Cheerleader Selection and Equitable Support
  - b. Equitable Use of All Facilities
  - c. Equitable Equipment/Uniform Replacement
  - d. Equitable Recognition and Rewards
- 3. After Consultation with Principal Richard Hughes, the AD will work with Head Coaches to get policies approved and effective in 2002-2003 school year.

### SY 2002-2003

### Item

- 1. The GEC has determined that this year's evaluation has not found any one item for correction.
- 2. The AD will continue to work closely with all coaches to ensure gender equity.
- 3. This is an on-going process.

### SY 2003-2004

### Item A

- 1. Girls' Soccer Team Play on Wednesday Nights
- 2. The Girls' Soccer Team will attempt to schedule away from Wednesday night by utilizing Thursdays, when not in conflict with the boys, and Saturdays.
- 3. Beginning with the 2004 season, the Head Girls' Soccer Coach will schedule on Thursdays and Saturdays whenever possible. The LTSOA will be notified so that officials are available.

### Item B

- 1. Participation Compliance Loss Due to Expiration of Volleyball and Swimming Numbers.
- 2. The AD will review this with the administration and make recommendation for the addition of female sports programs at the ninth grade level, possibly soccer and softball.
- 3. Ninth grade softball team added in Spring, 2005. Soccer added Freshman schedule in 2007.

### Item C

- 1. Booster Organization Fundraising
- 2. The A.D. will closely monitor benefits provided in all sports and will inform Principal Bill Adams, if an imbalance appears.
- 3. This, too, is an ongoing process, and the Principal and A.D. will review Title IX Form T35 annually.
