

The meeting was opened and closed with prayer.

Rick Folden, Athletic Director, informed us he found the error in the Financial Report. The error was due to a typing mistake. The amount reported was \$1200 for Athletic Awards. It should have been \$119.50. This is being reported to the Commission with an attached copy showing the error.

We discussed 3 areas of information needed.

1. How many games the Cheerleaders cheered? Answer is fourteen (14).
2. Athletic storage areas. One (1) of the closets in the Concession Stand, the bathroom and closet in the Athletic Director's office and the closet in the Assistant Director's office.
3. Locker Rooms. Elementary classrooms are used since they are closer to the gym. Particularly Room six (6) for the girls and Room seven (7) for the boys.

We were informed that an Interscholastic Athletics Student Survey will be administered this year. It is to be completed by grades 8-12 the second week of March by 90% of this student body. The committee will help to compile the information from this survey so that a report can be submitted.




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

Title IX Committee Meeting

April 23, 2018

The committee met on Tuesday, April 23, 2018. Present were Rick Folden,
Lydia Cyrus, Keller Mackey and Marie Settle.

Our objective was the discussion of the Title IX Preliminary Report.

On April 16, 2018 a letter was written in regards of each member of the committee receiving a copy of the report. This letter was signed by each member. A copy of that letter and a copy of the Preliminary Report are attached to these minutes.

The following pages of the report were discussed:

*page7 – In comparing the percentage of girls (49.3%) to boys (50.7%) participating in athletics the school should be in compliance.

*page9 – Discussed the Student Survey that was done. There was 108% return percentage.

1. There is sufficient interest in Archery, Competitive Cheer and Bowling. We will be introducing Archery this next year. Practice has been arranged at Tom Sawyer Park for 2 days a week.

5. We discussed other sports that were mentioned on the survey and reasons why they are not feasible for our school. Reasons being financial hardship due to our size, lacking of facilities, etc. It is felt we need to keep in mind when introducing a new sport we do not jeopardize an existing sport. Example is when Tennis was introduced, we could of jeopardized baseball and softball.

*page 11 – Discussed the Financial Report. The school spends an average of \$123 per girl to \$101 per boy. Reasoning for the cost per girl being higher enrollment for girls than boys.

*page 14 – Discussed areas where improvements could be made in JV Girls Basketball and the Soccer program.

*page 15 – Discussed the calculations per sport.

*page 17 – It was explained to the committee how numbers were totaled along with percentages. For example if an athlete played on 3 different teams they are considered 3 athletes. Here again we should be within compliance.

It felt by the committee that overall the school should be in compliance with Title IX.

The meeting was adjourned.
