Our survey revealed an interest in girls volleyball and that interest has surfaced before in the past. Being a small private school and with our enrollment down we have struggled the past several years getting sufficient numbers to field all of the teams that we currently offer which is considerable given our size. Adding an additional team would place significant additional strain on female participation and we would run the risk of losing other girls sports. However, in response to the interest that we saw in our survey, we have started to hold volleyball practices for any interested girls this spring but have not made it a competitive interscholastic team. We will be using these practices and gauging the participation to see how strong the interest truly is.

Travel and Per Diem- Coaches may request reimbursement for professional development and required certification and/or training. Reimbursement for professional development, travel, mileage, meals, lodging or other expenses must be reasonable and approved in advance by the Director of Athletics.

For travel to games/matches outside of Fayette County, the school will provide transportation for student athletes via bus or suburban. Students are responsible for their own transportation to any game/match within Fayette County. If students travel longer distances for games or tournaments that require an overnight stay, students are responsible for their own lodging cost. Furthermore, students are responsible for the cost of all meals or other expenses incurred when traveling. Sayre provides transportation via bus or suburban to regularly practices after school.

Storage Space- Storage space for all athletic equipment and uniforms is available to all coaches and teams. Uniform and equipment storage space is located upstairs in the gym adjacent to the cardio room. Uniforms should be inventoried and stored clean and folded in plastic bins to maintain them in the off season. Additional equipment storage is also available at the Sayre Athletic Complex for Fall and Spring sports. SAC storage space is located in the in storage area nearest the tennis courts.

Locker/Changing Rooms- Gym locker room space for girls is located at the North end of the C.V. Whitney Gymnasium and an identical space for boys is located at the South end. At the athletic complex, home and visitor changing rooms for both boys and girls are likewise available. The boys changing rooms are located in the pavilion on the side of the building closest to the tennis courts. Girls changing rooms are located on the opposite side of the building.

Post Season Banquets and Awards- Post season banquets are to be scheduled by the coach for Upper School teams. The cost of any banquet passed on to the Department of Athletics is not to exceed \$200.00. Guidelines for awarding varsity letters and bars can be found in the Coaches Handbook and varsity status for said recognition is at the sole discretion of the coach. Awards for Upper School sports teams will be purchased by the Department of Athletics and should be approved in advance. The Director of Athletics and coaches will exercise care to assure that the type, cost, and number of awards given is consistent with other varsity teams. JV and Middle School athletes may receive a certificate of participation at the discretion of the
